Whereas the Parliament of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the fourth day of January proximo: Now I, Charles Robert, Baron Carrington, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament to Tuesday, the eighteenth day of January now next ensuing: And I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the said Parliament shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid eighteenth day of January next, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Council Chambers, situate in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney: And the members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twentyfirst day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the fiftieth year of her Majesty's reign.


