# THIRTEENTH PARLIAMENT-FIRST SESSION.

: (Gazette, No. 98.)

Proclamation by his Excellency the Right Honorable CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRINGTON, a member of her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the colony of New South Wales and its dependencies.

In pursuance of the power and authority vested in me as such Governor aforesaid, by virtue of the act initialed "An Act to confer a Constitution on New South Wales and to grant a Civil List to her Majesty," as assented to by her Majesty under the authority of the act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the session of the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of her said Majesty, initialed "An Act to enable her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of New South Wales to confer a Constitution on New South Wales and to grant a Civil List to her Majesty,"—I do hereby proclaim that a session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly for the colony of New South Wales, for the despatch of business, shall commence and be holden on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at 12 o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Legislative Council Chambers, in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney; and the members of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Government House, Sydney, this fifteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of her Majesty's reign.

APPROPRIATION ACT (51 Vic. No. 14)-
