ANZAC MEMORIAL (BUILDING) ACT (GEO. V, No. 27, 1923)—

An Act to incorporate persons holding certain official positions as the Trustees of the Anzac Memorial Building; to vest certain moneys collected from the public in, and to confer certain powers upon, the said corporation; to amend the Trustees Audit Act, 1912; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruntnell, 1 November, 1923. Assented to, 12 December, 1923.]

APPROPRIATION ACT (GEO. V, No. 20, 1923)—

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1923, to the 30th day of June, 1924 (inclusive of both dates); to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer." 1922-23, Consolidated Revenue Fund, for supplementary charges during the period from the 1st day of July, 1922, to the 30th day of June, 1923 (inclusive of both dates), to cover payments "Unauthorised in Suspense," Consolidated Revenue Fund, for urgent claims on account of services of the year 1922-23; to provide for public works and other services out of the Public Works Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Sir Arthur Cocks, 18 October, 1923. Assented to, 30 November, 1923.]

BLACKHEATH WATER SUPPLY ACT (GEO. V, No. 39, 1923)—

An Act to sanction the construction of works of water supply for the Municipality of Blackheath. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 12 December, 1923. Assented to, 21 December, 1923.]

BREAD (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 19, 1923)—

An Act to amend the Bread Act, 1901, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Oakes, 24 October, 1923. Assented to, 26 November, 1923.]

BYRON BAY JETTY ACT (GEO. V, No. 41, 1923)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a jetty at Byron Bay; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 12 December, 1923. Assented to, 21 December, 1923.]

CAMURRA TO BOGGABILLA RAILWAY ACT (GEO. V, No. 49, 1923)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Camurra to Boggabilla; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 12 December, 1923. Assented to, 21 December, 1923.]

CHILD WELFARE ACT (GEO. V, No. 21, 1923)—

An Act to amend and consolidate certain Acts relating to children. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Bruntnell, 28 August, 1923. Assented to, 30 November, 1923.]

CHURCH OF ENGLAND TRUST PROPERTY (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 26, 1923)—

An Act to amend the Church of England Trust Property Act, 1917, and the King's School Council Act. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. Sir Joseph Carruthers, 17 October, 1923. Assented to, 8 December, 1923.]

- CHURCH OF ENGLAND TRUST PROPERTY (AMENDMENT) ACT (No. 2) (Geo. V, No. 28, 1923)**—
 An Act to amend the Church of England Trust Property Act, 1917, in certain respects; to validate the formation of existing dioceses, and to sanction the existing boundaries thereof; to provide for the formation of new dioceses, and for the alteration of boundaries of dioceses; to validate conveyances of trust property of the Church of England in certain cases; to waive conditions of forfeiture in Crown grants of trust property of the Church of England; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ley, 23 October, 1923. Assented to, 14 December, 1923.]
- CLOSER SETTLEMENT PURCHASES VALIDATION ACT (Geo. V, No. 11, 1923)**—
 An Act to validate certain settlement purchases; and for that purpose to amend certain Acts. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. Sir Joseph Carruthers, 6 September, 1923. Assented to, 4 October, 1923.]
- CONVEYANCING (AMENDMENT) ACT (Geo. V, No. 15, 1923)**—
 An Act to amend the law with regard to easements of air; and for that purpose to amend the Conveyancing Act, 1919. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. Sir Joseph Carruthers, 6 September, 1923. Assented to, 25 October, 1923.]
- CO-OPERATION, COMMUNITY SETTLEMENT, AND CREDIT ACT (Geo. V, No. 1, 1924)**—
 An Act to amend the law relating to co-operation; to provide for the formation, registration, and management of co-operative societies, including rural societies, trading societies, community settlement societies, community advancement societies, building societies, rural credit societies, urban credit societies, investment societies, and associations and unions of societies; to provide for an advisory council; and to repeal the Building and Co-operative Societies Act, 1901, and to amend the Income Tax (Management) Act, 1912, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. - CROWN LANDS AMENDMENT (DISPOSAL) ACT (Geo. V, No. 6, 1923)**—
 An Act to provide for the disposal of lands acquired by purchase or otherwise as if such lands had been duly acquired under the provisions of the Closer Settlement Acts; to amend the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Wearne, 5 September, 1923. Assented to, 2 October, 1923.]
- CROWN LANDS PURCHASE VALIDATION ACT (Geo. V, No. 10, 1923)**—
 An Act to validate a certain additional conditional purchase made by John Kane. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. Sir Joseph Carruthers, 6 September, 1923. Assented to, 4 October, 1923.]
- CROWN PURCHASES VESTING ACT (Geo. V, No. 9, 1923)**—
 An Act to declare that certain lands purchased by the Crown were vested in the Crown; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. Sir Joseph Carruthers, 6 September, 1923. Assented to, 4 October, 1923.]
- CURL CURL TO FRESHWATER TRAMWAY ACT (Geo. V, No. 55, 1923)**—

- DRUMMOYNE TO FIVE DOCK TRAMWAY ACT (Geo. V, No. 56, 1923)**—
 An Act to sanction the construction of a line of tramway from Drummoyne, along Lyon's-road, to Five Dock; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 20 December, 1923. Assented to, 21 December, 1923.]
- DUBBO GAS AND ELECTRICITY FRANCHISE ACT (Geo. V, No. 18, 1923)**—

FACTORS (MERCANTILE AGENTS) ACT (GEO. V, No. 2, 1923)—

An Act to amend and consolidate the law relating to factors; to repeal the Factors Act, 1899, and certain other Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Bill of previous session. Message from Legislative Council to Legislative Assembly, requesting resumption of proceedings, 8 August, 1923. Assented to, 20 September, 1923.]

GEORGE'S RIVER BRIDGE ACT (GEO. V, No. 23, 1923)—

An Act to authorise the construction by the Shire of Sutherland of a bridge across George's River; to amend the Local Government Act, 1919; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 24 October, 1923. Assented to, 5 December, 1923.]

GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 36, 1923)—

An Act to provide that the present Chief Railway Commissioner for New South Wales and Assistant Railway Commissioners for New South Wales shall remain in office until, and shall cease to hold office at, a date to be appointed by the Governor; to amend the Government Railways Act, 1912, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 6 December, 1923. Assented to, 21 December, 1923.]

GOVERNMENT SAVINGS BANK (AMENDMENT) ACT (GEO. V, No. 32, 1923)—

An Act to amend the Government Savings Bank Act, 1906, and certain other Acts; to validate certain acts of the Commissioners; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Sir Arthur Cocks, 27 November, 1923. Assented to, 19 December, 1923.]

HABERFIELD TO DOBROYD POINT TRAMWAY ACT (GEO. V, No. 57, 1923)—

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of tramway from Haberfield to Dobroyd Point; and for purposes connected therewith. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Ball, 20 December, 1923. Assented to, 21 December, 1923.]

HAWKESBURY AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE (LABORATORY) ACT (GEO. V, No. 43, 1923)—
