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**Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder:** A member is entitled to be heard in silence, 3289; and other members should not interject but should seek the call, 4137.

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**Adjournment (S.O. 49):** Matters of a local nature should not be raised under this standing order, the application of which is confined to matters of public importance affecting large areas of the State, 5381.

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It is not in order to treat bills as being cognate when they are at different stages of their passage through the House, 3901.

**Debate:** No member may reflect on the statutes of the House, 4412.

In exercising freedom of speech and making statements in the public interest, a member must act with restraint, 5494; and accept full responsibility for his remarks, 1886; particularly if they are about persons outside the House, 1888; who have no right of audience and are defenceless in the face of irresponsibility. A member should not reflect on private citizens unless compelling considerations of public interest require him to do so, 5495.

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In replying to criticism, a member may not attack his critic on personal grounds, 733.

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A member who quotes from a letter must give the name and address of the writer, 1510.

**Grievance Debate:** A member must confine himself to one subject of particular concern to him and his electorate. He may not canvass a number of matters in the one contribution, even though he has sufficient time in which to do so, 4653.

**Hansard:** Material to be incorporated must be shown first to Mr Speaker in his Chambers. It must be brief, and of a statistical type. Objection by any member will preclude its incorporation, 1333.

**Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder:** Interjections are disorderly, 1426; and the Chair will deal with interjectors, 3934.

A member who has already been called to order by name should be specially mindful 3304; ignore interjections, 184, 508, 579,

Members should not interrupt, but should seek the call, 509, 511, 1115, 1118, 1311, 1604, 1661, 3117, 3497, 3500, 3979, 4382, 4403, 5278, 5280, 5944, 5947; or wait and exercise a right of reply, 1677, 3934, 5271, 5838.

Members who wished to engage in conversation should leave the Chamber, 365, 701; and should leave quietly, 2335, 4925, 5960.

The conduct of members in the House influences the attitude of the community to Parliament, 5789; and although the vibrant nature of the community is reflected in Parliament, democracy requires a guarantee of a fair hearing for all, 3109.

A member should be heard in silence, 193, 357, 752, 1311, 3950, 4344, 4404, 5960, 6595; for interjections and interruptions reduce the time available for debate, 1013, 5963.

A member who interjects continually will be named, 193, 889, 4243; as will a member who does not take cognizance of the Chair when he rises to speak, 174, 5491; but it is not incumbent on the Chair to call a member to order by name. Whenever he calls for order, he addresses the exhortation to all members, including Government supporters, who at that time are transgressing the rules and practice of the House. If a member persists in interjecting or engaging in disorderly conduct, he may be removed without being named specifically, 184, 894, 1230, 1510, 2783, 5487, 5492, 6595.

A member who has already been called to order by name should be specially mindful of that injunction, 184, 1283, 6089.

If, because of the lateness of the hour, the application of Standing Order 392 would have little punitive effect, the Chair might resort to Standing Order 387, 1230, 2217, 3978, 4405.

Judiciary: The conduct of a member of the judiciary may be criticized by way of substantive motion only. It is not permissible to impute to a member of the judiciary improper motives or to make reflections, insinuations, or innuendoes in a general way, 6285.

Ministerial Statements: A reply to a ministerial statement may dispute the validity of conclusions based on fact, 565, 4532; criticize the policy enunciated, and advance alternative policy, but may not canvass the activities of a government department or its record, 565.

A lengthy and detailed answer to a question will not be ruled a ministerial statement if it does not deal with government policy, 1889, 2174; or if it is a direct answer to a question, but deferred to avoid eroding question time, 5774.

Obituary: Skelton, W. P. J., M.B.E., a former member of the Legislative Assembly, 34.

*Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions:* No member may reflect on the statutes of the House, 4412.

Good temper and moderation are the characteristics of parliamentary language, and are never more desirable than when a member is canvassing in debate the opinions and conduct of his opponents, 732, 1884.

A member who wishes to charge another must do so by way of substantive motion, and in reply the member charged is limited to dealing with the criticism of him. He is not entitled to attack his accuser on personal grounds, 733.

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**Assembly, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of Chair** (continued):

SPEAKER, MR (THE HON. LAWRENCE BORTHWICK KELLY) (continued):

No member shall use offensive or unbecoming words in reference to any member of either House, or make imputations of improper motives about or personal reflections on any other member, 732; but all members must expect to be the target of rugged and forthright criticism; they should not be too protective of their dignity, and must not allow themselves to become intolerant of all criticism. The Chair will decide what is improper and what is fair, 732, 5287.

Members who criticize other members must accept responsibility for their remarks, 732.

A member who is offended by the remarks of another may, at the appropriate time, make a personal explanation to correct misstatements about him, 473, 732; or seek redress under other standing orders and forms of the House by raising a matter of privilege, moving to censure his accuser, or asking for the withdrawal of the offending words, 469, 1884.

Although Standing Order 151 prohibits reflections on a member of either House, if a member makes a public statement involving such a reflection, it may be answered in Parliament, 1012.

The Chair will require remarks to be withdrawn on the ground that they are offensive only if the member concerned objects to them, 695, 5780. A member cannot ask for the withdrawal of remarks made about another member, 732, 1659. Failure to request withdrawal of remarks alleged to be offensive precludes a direction being given to that effect, 1329.

It is unparliamentary to use the word "lies" when describing statements made by another member, 4365. A member was warned for saying, after being called to order, ". . . if he hits me. I shall hit back.", 2521; and the following expressions were required to be withdrawn: "He is renowned for his homosexual tendencies", 468; "They . . . had been looking after (him) and his party for years", 1886; "(He) will put false information before this House", 2668; "(He) has deliberately lied to suggest otherwise", 3652; "The House is being told a deliberate lie", 3935; "You are a liar", 4344; "(The member) told two specific lies", 4365; "You are telling lies", 5006.

A member objected to an assertion that he had been involved "in fiddling the ballots so that certain members of the Liberal Party

gained exemption" from national service. As he himself had made charges against his accuser, it was difficult for the Chair to deny his opponent an opportunity of replying. He would have to make a personal explanation showing how his character had been impugned or his position as a member affected. He had already denied the allegation and should not allow a slight to determine the course he followed, 473.

The conduct of a member of the judiciary may be criticized and reflected upon only by way of substantive motion. It is not permissible to impute improper motives or to make reflections, insinuations, or innuendoes in a general way, 6285.

A member would have an opportunity to reply to offensive remarks by making a personal explanation, but he had already denied the allegations giving offence, 473.

*Parliamentary Staff:* A member reflects gravely on the staff of Parliament, knowing that its members cannot enter into public controversy, by making a statement to the press critical of it, 1884; and should apologize for having done so, 1896.

*Personal Explanations:* With the leave of the House a member may make a personal explanation, 1324, 1890, 1894, 1895, 1988, 3892, 4545, 4546, 4694, 5011, 5288; even though there be no question before the House, 1895; and he must be allowed to complete it, 1325.

Personal explanations must be brief, 1325, 4545; and to the point, 5491.

A member must show the need to make a personal explanation, 4545; explain how his character has been reflected upon or impugned, 185, 473, 1325, 4545, 5288, 5491; and deal with that point alone, 4544. He may not advance argument, 185, 474, 4545; or enter into debate, 1895, 4545, 5491, 5492.

In seeking to make a personal explanation a member may not trifle with the House, 5492.

An attack on a member's view of his own worth is not a ground for making a personal explanation, 185; nor is an assertion that he failed to make representations about a matter, for many such statements are made, and to allow a personal explanation on each of them would delay the business of the House, 5793.

Standing Order 137 may not be used to debate matters that have already been dealt with, 5491, 5492.

A member had not shown how his character had been impugned, but was allowed to continue, 5491.

**Points of Order:** A member who takes a point of order must be allowed to complete it, 5493. He must show how the remark or incident complained of is out of order, and he must take the point of order at the time the remark is made or the incident occurs, 647.

A member must confine himself to his point of order, 895, 1887, 2178, 5381; come quickly to it, 1887, 1896, 1968, 2178; not enter into debate, 1887, 2177, 5381; and leave it to the Chair to decide whether the point is well taken, 895.

A member may not speak to order if nothing is before the House to constitute a breach of order, 1327.

Members are entitled to complete their contributions to a debate without having their time eroded by frivolous points of order, 733; and a member in taking a point of order may not trifle with the House, 806, 2177.

A point of order cannot be taken on an incident during a division after the result of the division has been declared, 371.

The Chair did not rule on one point of order as the matter complained of had been answered in submissions made on the point involved, 215.

**Privilege:** Freedom of speech under privilege is the right of every member, and it is subject only to observance of the forms and

practices of the House, 1884. A member who abuses that right does so at his own risk and at the risk of incurring the displeasure of the public and the censure of the House, 1069, 1884. It is not for the Chair to take action against him. Good temper and moderate language should characterize a member's exercise of this right, particularly when canvassing the opinions and conduct of his opponents, 1884.

A member may rise on a matter of privilege at first opportunity, 1327; and may use that form of the House if he is offended by the remarks of another member, 1884.

A member who does not use that form or other forms of the House to remedy what he regards as an injustice by the Chair, but resorts to the mean, despicable and cowardly method of making a statement to the press on the matter, undermines the dignity of Parliament and the office of Speaker, for the Chair cannot enter into controversy through the news media, 1884.

A member raising a matter of privilege must foreshadow a substantive motion, 1324, 1327, 1328, 4696; to assist the Chair in determining whether a *prima facie* case exists, 1328. He is allowed ten minutes in which to establish such a case, 1328, 4696; showing how his functioning as a member of Parliament has been affected by the actions of which he complains, 1323; and must conclude his remarks by moving the foreshadowed motion, 1323. A member who fails to establish a *prima facie* case is not entitled to move such a motion; and if he does not so move, the Chair is not obliged to rule whether he has established grounds for such a motion, 1324.

A motion of privilege may not include censure of another member, 1328.

A member does not establish a *prima facie* case of breach of privilege by quoting a ruling by the Chair, 4697.

A Minister does not breach privilege by following the longstanding practice of tabling documents, 1324; nor by releasing copies of them outside Parliament and not providing copies for party leaders, 1323, 1324.

A member must be referred to by the name of his constituency, 1426.

A member may not bring an electronic device into the Chamber, 382.

A member had not been allowed ten minutes in which to establish a *prima facie*

breach of privilege because of disorderly conduct by other members, but his time was not extended, 4698.

Procedure: The House is master of its own affairs, and the Government can avoid procedural difficulties in pursuit of the will of Parliament, 2823,

Members must address the Chair, 3014; not the gallery, 3014, 3015; or interjectors, 3015.

A member may not raise a matter while the Chair is going through the business paper for the placing or disposing of business, 1896.

As standing orders provide that a Minister may speak for only ten minutes on a motion for leave to introduce legislation, the Standing Orders Committee might consider whether that provision is appropriate to the introduction of cognate bills, 2881.

At the introductory stage of a bill, a member may not make a second reading debate speech, 3588.

If a Minister declares a bill to be urgent, the Chair will forthwith put to the House the question that it be considered an urgent bill. Members of the Opposition are entitled to vote against the proposal at that point, 5798.

Provided copies of a bill have been circulated, the question that a bill be considered an urgent bill, which is to be put forthwith, can be put at any time, even after the second reading motion has been moved, 5798.

A member may not attach conditions to an amendment moved in accordance with Standing Order 253. He may move only that the second reading of a bill be deferred for a period he stipulates, 2916.

A member may not move that the adoption of a report of the Committee of the Whole be deferred when a motion has been moved for the adoption of that report, 3000.

A member may not move twice that another member be not further heard on the one subject, 2177.

A member who is dissatisfied with a ruling of the Chair may move a motion of dissent, 4698.

It is not in order to treat bills as being cognate when they are at different stages of their passage through the House, 3901.

A member who directed a question to the Chair about the length of a Minister's answer was told that his point related to

the conduct of the House, and that he should discuss the matter with Mr Speaker in his chambers, 2293; as was a member who, after the time for questions, sought advice on the application of the sub judice rule during question time, 4694.

Questions: All members were concerned about the erosion of question time, 5152.

A question without notice must be in acceptable form, 54, 2170, 5495. It should be brief and concise, 1190, 1752, 2170, 3564, 4251, 4628; and seek information, 2170, 3241; or press for action, 2170. It must not contain a great deal of argument, 561, 2170, 2518, 3568, 4251, 5372; or information, 2170, 4251, 4628. It must not offer or seek an opinion, 458, 3242, 3568, 4249, 4251; or include more facts than are necessary to make clear the nature of the inquiry, 3239, 3568, 4249, 4684.

A question must deal with a matter within the portfolio of the Minister to whom it is addressed, 5495.

A member must accept responsibility for the contents of his question, 5495.

Use of the expressions "Is the Minister aware" or "Is it a fact" are tantamount to giving information, 3568.

A member may not direct a question to a Minister seeking an apology for a statement made on a former occasion, 4685.

Previous decisions on the orderliness of questions should not be allowed to become unduly restrictive. The Chair will have regard to the basic rules governing the form and content of questions, but will not consider itself bound, when interpreting those rules, to disallow a question solely on the ground that it conflicts with any previous ruling, 3571.

The Chair is concerned about the use of coloured language to frame questions, 2293.

Question time is wasted by interjections, 3431, 5152; and members should not misuse question time by asking additional questions by way of interjection, 1978.

A member was permitted to ask whether the federal Budget would have certain effects, for the Chair believed the Minister could give facts, not his opinion, in answering it, 459.

A member was given an opportunity of redrafting a question that was considered to be too long, 3564; or in other ways offended against the rules governing the asking of questions, 458, 3568.

A member was allowed to complete his question so that the Chair could determine whether it was in order, 3241.

A member from whose electorate school-children were visiting the House would have been given the call at question time had his colleagues not sought to obtain priority, 2798.

Though part of a question was argumentative, it was allowed, but the member asking it was reminded of his obligation to frame questions carefully, 5372.

A question asked upon notice, though lengthy, conformed with the practices of the House and was allowed, 5495.

A question was allowed: 54, 459, 2293, 3571, 4684, 5372, 5495.

A question was disallowed: 56, 170, 456, 1101, 2170, 2518, 3242, 4249, 4628, 4683, 4685, 5150.

The rules governing the answering of questions are different from those governing the asking of them, 2179. An answer must be relevant to the question, 1986, 3105, 3108, 4806, 5152, 5780; but it is not the practice for the Chair to control the way in which a Minister replies, 1099, 1888, 2179, 3108, 5780; though question time is eroded when a Minister debates an issue, 1099; and a Minister may not, under the guise of answering a question, attack the character and conduct of a member, 5780.

It is in order for a Minister to use detailed material prepared in anticipation of a question, 1888.

A lengthy and detailed answer will not be ruled a ministerial statement if it does not bear on government policy, 1889; nor will a similar answer given in direct response to a question, but deferred to avoid eroding question time, 5774.

A Minister might not be able to answer in reasonable time a question consisting of many parts, 1752, 4920.

A Minister was permitted to amplify by way of deferred answer his reply to earlier questions, which he was unable to complete at the time, 4241.

Interjections extend the time taken to answer questions, 1986.

Even though a member had been given the call to ask a question, a Minister was permitted to continue his answer to the previous question after stating that he had not finished it, 3241.

Although a member may take up remarks made by previous speakers in a debate on an amending bill, he should make only passing reference to the Act to be amended, 1856.

At the introductory stage of a bill a member must confine his remarks to the Minister's speech and may, to a limited extent, canvass the proposed bill, but is not in order in debating at length whether the Government has a mandate for such legislation, 3588.

A motion designed to give precedence to Government business, thereby preventing debate on other matters, does not give opportunity for debating those other matters, 2795, 2796; though passing reference may be made to them, 2795. Other forms of the House are available for raising pressing problems, 2797, 2798. In those circumstances a reference to the curtailment of question time was not in order, 2799.

As some contributions to a debate had covered matters not included in the question before the Chair, a Minister was in order in replying to them, 2215.

**Strangers:** Representatives of an assembly in Japan were permitted to film part of the proceedings in the House, 3241.

The Chair controls the use of tape recorders and cameras by strangers in the House, and a member who wishes to discuss an individual decision should raise it with Mr Speaker in his chambers, 4091.

**Sub Judice Rule:** A question or debate that breaches the sub *judice* rule is out of order, 171, 174, 3884, 4683; for a member may not make statements that would pre-

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judice the parties in a court case, 893; or the issue before a Royal commission, 4683; or in some way might influence or embarrass a Royal commission in making a decision, 4683. He may state that a person is before a court on a particular charge, but if he goes further than that, he breaches the rule, 896; which applies to events of recent occurrence that would, in the ordinary course, be dealt with by a court, 174.

The Chair accepts the advice of the Attorney-General on whether a matter is before a court, 3882.

Canvassing by the press of matters that are the subject of litigation does not affect the application of the *sub judice* rule in parliamentary proceedings, 174.

A member was allowed to continue asking a question in order that the Chair could determine whether it breached the *sub judice* rule, but he was warned of that possibility, 52.

A member who, after the time for questions had expired, sought advice from the Chair on the application of the *sub judice* rule during question time was instructed that it would have been better if he had raised the matter with the Speaker privately, 4694.

**Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions:** Inflection and tone of voice do not constitute grounds for asking that a remark be withdrawn, 3341.

**Points of Order:** Not involved, 2494, 2640; or not upheld, 2642.

A member was asked to come to his point of order, 2640.

**Relevance:** Debate on the principles of a bill is appropriate to the second reading stage. In Committee members must confine their remarks to the clauses or schedules before the Chair, 2064.

Remarks must be relevant to the question before the Chair. It is for the Minister to choose whether he will, as a courtesy, answer a question about a provision already dealt with by the Committee, 3412.

A member was asked to say which item or items of a schedule he was debating, 2864.

PRESIDENT (THE HON. JOHN RICHARD JOHNSON):

**Abstention from Alcohol,** 4037.

**Adjournment:** Discussion of a motion for the adjournment of the House is, by its nature, irregular, but much latitude has been allowed. The only matters proper to be raised are those in respect of which the Government may act administratively, 6076.

A motion for adjournment presents the last opportunity for a member to raise a matter of urgent public importance. He must make his point succinctly and quickly, and the matter may not be debated, 995.

Upon a point of order being taken that a member was debating a matter he raised in

speaking to a motion for adjournment, the member concluded his remarks, 2656.

**Christmas Felicitations,** 4223.

**Council, Legislative:** Advice would be sought on projection equipment that might be installed for use by members when they were making speeches, 151.

**Debate:** Parliamentary debate is based on argument and counter-argument, 4306, 4307; and for that reason requests for the incorporation in *Hansard* of graphical, statistical or pictorial material should be approached with caution, 4307. The provision of projection equipment and similar devices to enable members to illustrate their speeches would not accord with the practices of the House or the objects of debate, and would be attended by administrative and other difficulties, 4306.

No member shall quote any debate in either House of the same session upon a question or a bill not being then under discussion, except by the indulgence of the House to enable a member to make a personal explanation, 986, 994.

Contributions to debate must be couched in temperate language, 2606, 4324; and brevity at a late hour of the sitting was advantageous to all members, 3869.

A member may not debate the form of future legislation, 3386; or by his remarks anticipate debate on a matter that might come before the House, 6076; nor may he ask a question that is related directly to a bill set down as an order of the day, 2412.

**Documents:** A member was asked to state the title of a document he sought leave to have incorporated in *Hansard*, 5924.

**Divisions:** Explanation of the President's withdrawal from a division of the Committee of the Whole, 3846.

**Hansard:** Centenary, 2297.

It is for the House, not the Chair, to decide whether graphical, pictorial or statistical material is incorporated in *Hansard*, 444, 447, 2486, 4306.

Some statistical and graphical material can be incorporated without difficulty, 4307; for the Government Printer is readily able to incorporate typed and tabulated material when printing blocks do not have to be made of it, but the necessity to make blocks or to reproduce some types of material could delay the publication of the official record of debates, 150, 4307.

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**Council, Legislative: Rulings, Observations and Opinions of Chair** (*continued*):PRESIDENT (THE HON. JOHN RICHARD JOHNSON) (*continued*):

The incorporation of photographs is undesirable, 4307; but leave was given for the inclusion of a photograph providing it was technically possible to reproduce it, 3367. Black and white photographs do not reproduce well on the paper used for the printing of *Hansard*, and the Government Printer is unable to reproduce colour transparencies, 4307.

All material incorporated affects the quality and flow of debate, 150, 4307; and if the House departs to any great extent from the accepted practice of basing debate on argument and counter-argument, requests for the incorporation of additional material in *Hansard* might result in many refusals, giving rise to a belief by some members that they are being unfairly treated, 4307.

The House should be alert to prevent unwarranted departures from the normal practice in this respect, 4307.

Objection precludes the incorporation of material in *Hansard*, 3863, 4307; but the House may reconsider its attitude, 3865.

Objection to the incorporation of material might be avoided by first showing it to the Minister. A Minister may not make a personal explanation in order to give the reason for objecting, 956; and a member who objects may not give reasons, 3869.

A member may not quote from a *Hansard* report of the current session, 3778.

*Interjections, Interruptions and Disorder*: Interjections are disorderly, 2373, 4320, 5749; for a member should be heard in silence, 251, 442, 1408, 1731, 2062, 2598, 1762, 2972, 3205, 4313, 6029, 6057, 6481, 6490, 6495.

Members were directed to reduce the level of audible conversation while a member was addressing the Chair, 345, 2761, 3220, 4784, 5719.

Members were called to order by name: Hon. F. J. Darling, 951, 5076; Hon. N. F. King, 6057; Hon. P. S. M. Philips, 6029; Hon. E. P. Pickering, 6050; Hon. B. J. Unsworth, 6075; Hon. M. F. Willis, 3205.

*Offensive and Objectionable Remarks, Imputations and Aspersions*: Offers to wager on the outcome of a social issue were inappropriate to debate in the Legislative Council, 2605.

A member was required to withdraw a suggestion that a Minister had been bought, 3531.

A member was required to withdraw the words, "At least I am sober", 5086.

*Parliament*: Members were expected to show respect for the parliamentary establishment and its appurtenances, 5073, 5076; and should ensure that there was no repetition of an incident in which an adhesive label bearing a political slogan was affixed to the mantelpiece in the members' lounge, 5073.

*Personal Explanations*: The House gives leave for members to make personal explanations, 2411.

In making a personal explanation a member may not debate an issue, 2411; and must come quickly to the matter he or she wishes to explain, 2411.

*Points of Order*: Upheld, 2050, 2063, 2392, 2767, 5137, 5707; disallowed, 2045, 2047, 3869, 4299, 5085, 5086; and not involved, 2044, 2483, 2620, 2762, 2766, 3539, 4323, 4327, 6496.

*Procedure*: Members must address the Chair, 1408.

The standing orders require that when the Chair rises to interpose, the member speaking shall sit. Custom obliged other members to remain seated while the Chair was standing, 3078, 4198.

Members should make clear whether they are seeking the call, 4198; and, when speaking, should refer to other members by their titles and surnames, 2458, 5224.

Members should not put their feet on the seats in the Chamber, 3078.

*Questions Without Notice*: Disallowed, 2392.

Questions must be brief and concise, 3990.

In asking a question, a member must seek information, not give it, 1391, 3990, 4884, 4888, 5610; must not advance argument, offer opinion, or state more facts than are necessary to make the question clear, 3333, 3990; and must not ask about a matter that is the subject of debate by the House, 2392, 2412.

Supplementary questions may be asked, 3080; and a question was held to be supplementary because it was concerned with the general subject of industrial relations, even though it referred to a different dispute, 4303.

An answer must be relevant to the question, 329.

*Relevance*: Remarks must be relevant to the question before the Chair, 2045, 2047, 2606, 2767, 4317, 4327, 5707, 5755, 6394, 6506; and confined to that question, 2050, 2063, 4320, 6394, 6506.

In speaking to a motion for the adjournment of the House, a member must not debate the merits of a matter but is limited to arguing that it should be dealt with administratively, 1624.

A member was permitted to continue with his comments after their relevance had been questioned and he had undertaken to substitute one expression for another, 1396.

*Sub Judice Rule*: A member was asked to give an assurance that a matter to which he referred was not before a court and, upon doing so, was allowed to continue with his remarks, 2757.

*Strangers*: Standing Order 23 provides that the President alone shall admit strangers to the area at the back of his chair. A request for admission will be declined in unusual circumstances only, but the member making such a request must vouch for the standing of the persons concerned, 3078.
