WHEREAS by an act passed in the second year of the reign of his late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, being "An Act to consolida e the Acts relating to the Constitution," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor of New South Wales may prorogue the Legislative Council and Assembly thereof from time to time: And whereas it is expedient to prorogue the said Council and Assembly: Now, therefore, I, Sir William Portus Cullen, the Lieutenant-Governor aforesaid—the Governor having departed from the State,—in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, do hereby prorogue the said Legislative Council and Assembly until Wednesday, the twenty-third day of August instant, and the same stand so prorogued accordingly: And I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the said Legislative Council and Assembly shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid twenty-third day of August instant, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Legislative Council Chambers, situate in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney: And the members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, respectively, are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place · accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Sydney, this first day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and in the second year of his Majesty's reign.

PUBLIC STATUTES OF THE SESSION.

TWENTY-SECOND PARLIAMENT—THIRD SESSION.

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the supplies granted for the service of the year from the 1st day of July, 1911, to 30th day of June, 1912 (inclusive of both dates); to adjust the vote "Advance to Treasurer," 1910-11, Consolidated Revenue Fund, for supplementary charges during the period

from the 1st day of July, 1910, to the 30th day of June, 1911 (inclusive of both dates); to adjust the Votes "Advance to Treasurer," 1903-4 and previous year, Consolidated Revenue Fund, for supplementary charges during the period from the 1st day of July, 1902, to the 30th day of June, 1904 (inclusive of both dates), to cover payments "Unauthorised in Suspense," Consolidated Revenue Fund, for urgent claims on account of services of the year 1910-11; to provide for public works and other services out of the Public Works Fund; and to provide for services out of the Closer Settlement Fund; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Dacey, 15 December, 1911. Assented to, 27 December, 1911.]

APPROPRIATION ACT (2 GEO. V No. 26, 1911)-

BARELLAN TO MIRROOL RAILWAY ACT (2 GEO. V No. 1, 1912)—
An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Barellan towards Mirrool; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; to amend the Public Works Act, 1900, so far as it relates to the making and maintaining of fences along the said line; to provide for the use of the said line by the constructing authority, or by persons authorised by him; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 28 February, 1912. Assented to, 28 March, 1912.

BURSARIES ENDOWMENT ACT (2 GEO V No. 14, 1912)--

An Act to establish a fund for bursaries tenable in secondary schools and in the Sydney University; to constitute a board of control; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carmichael, 8 March, 1912. Assented to, 4 April, 1912.]

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND AND PUBLIC WORKS FUND ACT (2 GEO. V No. 8, 1911)-An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund towards the services of the year 1911-12; and out of the Public Works Fund; and for services to be hereafter provided for by loan. [Initiated, in the Assembly by Mr. Carmichael, 27 September, 1911. Assented to, 29 September, 1911.]

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND AND PUBLIC WORKS FUND ACT (No. 2) (2 GEO. V No. 19, 1911)-An Act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund towards the services of the year 1911-12; and out of the Public Works Fund; and for services to be hereafter provided for by loan. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Dacey, 30 November, 1911.] Assented to, 2 December, 1911.]

CRIMES (GIRLS' PROTECTION) AMENDMENT ACT (2 GEO. V No. 21, 1911)—
An Act to amend the Crimes Act. 1900, and the Crimes (Girls' Protection) Act, 1910. [Initiated in the Council by the Hon. F. Flowers, 22 November, 1911. Assented to, 21 December, 1911.]

CRIMINAL APPEAL ACT (2 GEO. V No. 16, 1912) -An Act to establish a court of criminal appeal; to amend the law relating to appeals in criminal cases; to provide for better consideration of petitions of convicted persons; to amend the Crimes Act of 1900; to amend the Supreme Court Act of 1900; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Holman, 21 November, 1911. Assented to, 16 April, 1912.]

CROWN LANDS AMENDMENT ACT (2 GEO. V No. 6, 1912) -An Act to provide for the setting apart and disposal of Crown lands as homestead farms, suburban holdings, and Crown leases, and for the disposal of lands within duly constituted irrigation areas; to amend the Crown Lands Acts, the Closer Settlement Acts, the Newcastle Pasturage Reserve Act, 1900, the Public Roads Act, 1902, and the Murrumbidgee Irrigation Act. 1910, in cortain respects; and for purposes consequential thereon and incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Beeby, 27 February, 1912. Assented to, 2 April, 1912.]

1) UNEDOO TO COONABARABRAN RAILWAY ACT (2 GEO. V No. 12, 1911)-

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Dunedoo to Coonabarabran; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; to amend the Public Works Act, 1900, so far as it relates to the making and maintaining of fences along the said line; to provide for the use of the said line by the constructing authority, or by persons authorised by him; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 21 September, 1911. Assented to, 7 November, 1911.]

FINLEY TO TOCUMWAL RAILWAY ACT (2 GEO. V No. 3, 1912)-

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Finley to Tocumwal; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; to amend the Public Works Act, 1900, so far as it relates to the making and maintaining of fences along the said line; to provide for the use of the said line by the constructing authority, or by persons authorised by him; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 28 February, 1912. Assented to, 28 March, 1912.]

Forbes to Stockinbingal Railway Act (2 Geo. V No. 10, 1911)-

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Forbes to Stockinbingal; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; to amend the Public Works Act, 1900, so far as it relates to the making and maintaining of fences along the said line; to provide for the use of the said line by the constructing authority, or by persons authorised by him; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 28 September, 1911. Assented to, 7 November, 1911.]

GALONG TO BURROWA RAILWAY ACT (2 GEO. V No. 2, 1912)-

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of railway from Galong to Burrowa; to authorise the construction of the said line on public roads; to amend the Public Works Act, 1900, so far as it relates to the making and maintaining of feuces along the said line; to provide for the use of the said line by the constructing authority, or by persons authorised by him; and for other purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Arthur Griffith, 28 February, 1912. Assented to, 28 March, 1912.]

HOUSING ACT (No. 2) (2 GEO. V No. 7, 1912)-

An Act to provide for the purchase, resumption, and appropriation of lands, and for the construction and maintenance of certain buildings and works; for the use or disposal of such lands and buildings; to constitute a board for the above and other purposes, and a fund to meet the expenses of carrying out the above provisions; for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto; and to amend certain acts. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carmichael, 23 March, 1912. Assented to, 4 April, 1912.]

INCOME-TAX ACT (2 GEO. V No. 24, 1911)-

An Act to amend the law relating to the assessment of and to impose an income-tax; to amend the Land and Income-tax Assessment Act of 1895, the Land and Income-tax Amendment) Act, 1897, the Land and Income-tax (Declaratory) Act, 1898, the Land and Income-tax (Amendment) Act, 1904, the Taxation Amending Act, 1905; to repeal the Income-tax Act of 1895, the Income-tax Deduction Act, 1907, and the Taxation Amending Act, 1906; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initialled in the Assembly by Mr. Dacey, 1 December, 1911.]

INCOME-TAX AMENDMENT ACT (2 GRO. V No. 15, 1912)-

An Act to amend the Income-tax Act, 1911. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Dacey, 6 March, 1912. Assented to, 4 April, 1912.]

INCOME-TAX (MANAGEMENT) ACT (2 GEO. V No. 11, 1912)-

An Act to provide for the assessment and collection of a tax on incomes, and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto; and to repeal and amend certain acts. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Dacey, 23 February, 1912. Assented to, 4 April, 1912.]

INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT (2 GEO. V No. 17, 1912)-

An Act to provide for the regulation of the conditions of industries in certain particulars by means of industrial conciliation and arbitration, and for the repression of lock outs and strikes; to establish and define the powers, jurisdiction, and procedure of an industrial court and certain subsidiary tribunals; to preserve certain awards and industrial agreements; to repeal the Industrial Disputes Act, 1908, the Industrial Disputes Amendment Act, 1908, the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1909, and the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1910; to amend the Clerical Workers Act, 1910, and certain other acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Beeby (for Mr. Carmichael), 17 November, 1911. Assented to, 15 April, 1912.]

- LOAN ACT (2 GEO. V No. 25, 1911)--

Henry Willis has forfeited the confidence of the House, 3099; debated by Mr. McGowen, 3102; Mr. Wade, 3110; Mr. Beeby, 3118; Mr. Fitzpatrick, 3121; Mr. Holman, 3127; Mr. Levy, 3132; Mr. Moxham, 3138; Dr. Arthur, 3141; Mr. Lonsdale, 3148; negatived, 3149.

Motion by Mr. Wade to dissent from Mr. Speaker's ruling terminating the debate on Mr. Levien's motion of censure, 3242; debated by Mr. McGowen, 3244; Mr. Perry, 3245; Mr. Price, 3246; negatived, 3248.

Motion by Mr. Wood to dissent from the action of Mr. Speaker in removing Mr. Cochran, 3374; debated by Mr. McGowen, 3377; Mr. Wade, 3378; Mr. Cochran, 3379 negatived, 3381.

Motion by Mr. Wade to dissent from the ruling of Mr. Speaker that the Housing Bill was a money bill, and that the amendments of the Legislative Council were an infringement of the privileges of the House;

SPEAKER, MB. (HON. HENRY WILLIS), RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF:

Address in Reply: A member was in order in referring to federal legislation, but would be out of order in referring to legislation to be introduced in the Legislative Council, or in objecting to a measure on the statute book, unless he proposed to repeal it, 436; when the Speaker called on a member, he had the right to speak. Mr. Speaker recognised no practice other than calling on the member who caught his eye, 460.

Adjournment: If a member were interested in a question he had an opportunity of bringing it forward and discussing it, but he would not vote, 865; a motion for adjournment to discuss the shortage of railway trucks was out of order, as the matter might be discussed under a notice of motion, 978: the merits of the case before a royal commission could not be discussed on a motion for adjournment to direct attention to the necessity of protecting witnesses, 1026; a motion of adjournment to discuss the release of an offender against the Industrial Disputes Act, was out of order for the reason that a bill for the repeal of the act was an order of the day, 1123; a member was out of order in imputing wrong motives, 1126, 1250; it was not competent to initiate a debate or to comment upon an answer given to a question, 1227, 1233, 1235, 1241, 1244; members must be respectful to the Chair and a withdrawal and apology was demanded when a gross charge was made against a responsible officer of the House, 1228; it was disorderly and offensive for a member to abruptly throw a book upon the table, 1235; on a motion for adjournment to discuss the purchase of land at Uhr's Point it was not competent for a member to make general charges against people outside, 1302; Mr. Speaker, instead of waiting to the last moment to withdraw motions of adjournment placed in the box provided for that purpose would in future withdraw the motions at any time when there was a lull to enable him to do so and make himself acquainted with the nature of the motion before calling on the business, 1328; a motion of adjournment to discuss railway administration was sufficiently definite and in order, 1373; a member was not entitled to go into the question of the importation of locomotives, 1394; a motion to discuss the widening of Macquarie-street by encroaching on the Botanic Gardens was not exclusively connected with the Botanic Gardens and was in order despite the fact that the Estimates had been laid upon the table and embraced a vote for the Botanic Gardens, 1532; the first bench on the right of the Speaker was reserved for Ministers, and other members were out of order in sitting there, 2255; there was no restriction in regard to moving, on a motion for

ASSEMBLY (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.): adjournment, that a member be no longer heard, 2258; a member could not discuss what had taken place in Committee, 2260; a motion for special adjournment could not be discussed, 2877; a motion of adjournment to discuss a definite matter of urgent public importance could not be taken on days upon which according to the sessional orders, only Government business should be dealt with, 3078; a motion could be before the House only when it was proposed and the first motion of adjournment not having been proposed, a second motion could be taken without submitting the question to the House, 3161; a motion to discuss the congestion of city traffic was out of order, as anticipatory of motions on the business-paper, 3161; the House had determined that it was not within the power of the Speaker to decide the question of urgency, which was disposed of when five members rose in their places, 3508; a motion to discuss the electrification of the Illawarra tramway system was not sufficiently definite, 3510; a motion to discuss certain statements of the Minister for Works, involving members and employees at the state brickworks, was out of order, 3560: a motion dealing with holiday railway rates for the police was anticipatory of a notice of motion and therefore, out of order, 4038; a motion relating to the mismanagement of the state brickworks was in order, as being definite, and was not anticipatory of a motion for a return, 4127; it was not out of order, because the subject matter had already been discussed on the Estimates, 4136.

Armed Police in Chamber: Police were called into the Chamber by Mr. Speaker to restore order; he could not say whether they were armed, 648.

Barellan-Mirool Railway: It was out of order to reply to interjections or to make reflections on the Chair, 1086; it was not irregular to give notice of the introduction of a bill in anticipation of the expediency motion being carried, showing that the expediency motion was an intimation that a bill was to follow, 3209; a member was entitled at the third-reading stage to try to persuade the House against passing a bill, but long speeches were not usual at that stage, 3387.

Broken Hill Amalgamated Miners' Association: Emphasising what some other member had said was not asking a second question on

the same subject, 695.

Chairman of Committees: In returning thanks for his election as Chairman, a member was entitled to make passing reference without argument to remarks which had fallen from other members, so long as he did not digress to any extent, 485.

Cobar Seat: A motion declaring vacant the Cobar seat could be taken with concurrence

ASSEMBLY (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.): without preventing the consideration at a subsequent stage of a motion occupying a prior place on the business-paper, 490.

Conduct of Mr. Speaker: It was out of order to ask a question which had previously been put, 650; as leader of the House the Premier controlled most things, and his wishes were equivalent to a command, 650; a motion deprecating the conduct of Mr. Speaker appeared on the business-paper as No. 24, because the member in whose name it stood did not avail himself of the first opportunity to move it as a question of privilege, 696; a precedent was not established by allowing a member to quote from Hansard of the current session, 705; a member must not impute motives, 708; Mr. Speaker could not possibly have an interview with the press, 709; there could not be a "roaming motion," nor could the Speaker's rulings be disputed, 711, 715, 716, 718, 721; it was not incumbent on the Speaker to answer any question put to him, 715; members must be respectful to the Chair, 716; it was the duty of the Chair, and not of members, to call for order, 717; a member must not take the law into his own hands, but appeal to the Chair, if objectionable words were used, 720; when Mr. Speaker was on his feet members must be silent, 723, 724; members who brought themselves under the operation of standing orders by disorderly conduct could be removed at any moment, as directed by Mr. Speaker, 725: a member was out of order in unnecessarily disturbing the course of the Premier's speech, 727; it was most disorderly for a member to attempt to make an explanation when another member was speaking, 729, or to interrupt, 732; the hon. member who tabled the motion should have moved under standing order 161; a motion calling in question the conduct of Mr. Speaker was irregular, and out of order, 733; the ruling was strictly in accordance with a ruling given in the House of Commons within the period embraced in the standing orders, 801; to put the Speaker on his trial with regard to his reputation or his honor, there must be some specific charge, 3010; two motions anticipatory of each other could not appear on the noticepaper at the same time, 3073.

Contempt: A member was guilty of contempt who deliberately left the Chamber without paying his respects to the Chair, at the same time using offensive language to the Chair, 1269; a member was out of order in passing remarks upon what had happened outside the Chamber, 1272; a member could not bring messages from outside, 1278; on a motion under standing order 335 for leave to move the recission of the resolution of suspension the discussion must be limited to the question of urgency, the merits of the case could not be entered upon, nor could

ASSEMBLY . (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.): exception be taken to the course of procedure originally adopted, 1660, 1661; the motion for leave was out of order because the rescissory motion had stood on the notice-paper and been called on earlier in the sitting, and as no one was present to move it, had lapsed, 1662; when a member who had been suspended wished to return, he would be shown to the bar by the Ser-jeant-at-Arms; a member who had been suspended from the service of the House until an apology had been made for his misconduct, and had been named under the standing orders, should be addressed by Mr. Speaker by his surname, and not the name of his electorate, 2394; an apology must be made without reservation and must be satisfactory to the House, it might be committed to writing, 2954.

Criminal Appeal Bill: When it was proposed to omit clauses on recommittal, it was the practice to allow members to speak not only on the amendments, but on the third reading, 2002; but a member could not go into details as in Committee, 2006, 2009.

Crown Lands Purchases and Leases Validation Bill: 'Where a motion was moved by a "front bencher" it was the practice not to

require a seconder, 2968.

Crown Lands (Amendment) Bill: So long as members conducted themselves respectfully they could sit anywhere, but it was usual for members to speak from the side of the House where it was customary for them to sit, 3315.

Decorum of Procedure: It was a breach of the standing orders for a member to leave the House when he was being addressed by the Speaker, or without paying his respects to

the Chair, 173.

Dissent from Mr. Speaker's Ruling: Where there was no standing order the House resorted to the custom and proceedings of the House of Commons, 175; there was a timehonored custom or procedure that a question of privilege should take precedence of everything else, 177, 275; if the House did not concur in the suggestion for the post-ponement of a motion of dissent, Mr. Speaker must take the responsibility of giving a ruling, 181; Mr. Speaker, in leaving the chair without question put, after returning from hearing the Governor's speech, was merely following the custom of the House of Commons, there being no standing orders directly bearing on the incident, 205; the Speaker had no opinion on any question unless there was an equality of votes, 364; a question was never before the House until it had been proposed and seconded, 363; a member must not reflect on the Chair, 363; a motion of urgency relating to a motion which had disappeared was out of order, 366; a member must not say that another member did not vote according to the dictates of his conscience; ASSEMBLY (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.): questions relating to any matter outside the House, and not bearing on any matters before the House, could not be put, 413; it was not obligatory for Mr. Speaker's words to be taken down, 525; members must not refer to the rulings of the House of Commons that applied here or to any standing orders as "grandiloquent non-sense," 912; members must not cast reflections upon a direction of the House or on what was stated from the Chair, 912; a member was out of order in reading the report of debates in Hansard; only a cursory reference could be permitted, 913; a member had no right to move that another member be further heard—the motion should come from the member aggrieved, 913; it was disorderly to make interjections of any kind, therefore any member interrupting the Premier or any other member would be very much out of order; a member could not rise and make an interjection and call it a point of order. 916; anything that was done was done by the House and not merely by a section of the House, 919; a member could quote to show that Mr. Speaker had acted in an irregular way, but was not in order in passing any strictures on Mr. Speaker, 920; it would be quite impossible for a Speaker to sell himself to a party—he was in his position clear of parties, 922; the Premier as leader of the House must be granted considerable latitude; a motion did not become the property of the House until it was seconded and stated to the House; a motion that was tabled and not upon the business-paper was not necessarily—there might be exceptions—the property of the House, 922; when a notice publicly given was obviously irregular or unbecoming, Mr. Speaker would interpose to prevent the notice being printed on the business-paper as being obviously designed merely to give annoyance-this was in accordance with a well-established practice of the House of Commons, 923; Mr. Speaker had no wish of his own; if the House were to say that he should allow a member to turn the House into a place unfit for gentlemen he must obey, but if the House said the opposite it was his duty as well as his trust to see that the will of the House was enforced without fear or favour, 923; a personal explanation would be out of order in moving a motion of dissent, 924; the House was not concerned in the member moving the motion or what he did-it was a matter of laying down something for the future guidance of the House, 925; it was necessary that every motion should be seconded, 926; it was not a reflection on the Chairman to dissent from Mr. Speaker's ruling—it was really a dissent from the ruling of the Chair as directed by the House. SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.): Speaker would at once give an opposite ruling, 926; a point of order must be stated concisely, 928; a question was not one of privilege because a member said it was—a question that could be discussed on any day was clearly not one of privilege, 929; a member was not the custodian of his own business; when notice of dissent was given, the motion became the property of the House, 2956; a notice of motion of dissent having been postponed, and not moved on the day appointed, would have to be the subject of fresh notice, but the motion could not come within the three days limit under the standing orders, 3009; it was improper to reflect on the intelligence of the House, 3246; a member could not quote from the report of a debate in the current session, 3375; a motion under standing order 161 must be confined to dissent from the Speaker's ruling, 3376; a reflection on the Chair was not a reflection on an individual, but on the House, 3379; it was not in consonance with the proper order of things for the mover of a motion to refuse to act as teller on division-if a member declined he was liable to have his vote recorded on the other side, 3380.

Ejection of Members: In directing the ejection of members, Mr. Speaker acted on his own authority, 220, 514; the House could take no cognisance of the press, 325, 401; it was not in order to ask questions reflecting on the action of the Chair in directing the removal of a member for being grossly offensive to the Chair, 790; the essence of privilege was that it should be brought forward at the earliest opportunity, and if a question of privilege were held over till Mr. Speaker had consulted the records, it would still be a matter of privilege—if the doubt as to the nature of the question were resolved in such a way as to justify Mr. Speaker in calling it on as privilege, 792; a member who wished to direct attention to a newspaper article with the intention of moving that the editor be called to the bar of the House must first move that the paragraphs be read by the Clerk, 793.

Elections and Qualifications Committee:—Mr. Speaker knew no parties, and appointed the committee irrespective of parties, in accordance with his judgment, and free from dictation or direction at the hands of the House, 379; a member whose resignation had been tendered was competent to act until his successor had been appointed; the resignation would not take effect until the vacancy was filled, 651.

Election of Speaker: The House had no cognisance of Hansard, nor could anyone vouch for the correctness of Hansard. 171; the House could take no cognisance of what was stated in the press or by officials outside the House; the responsible officer was the Clerk at the table, 172; whatever Mr.

ASSEMBLY (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.):

Speaker might do, the rights of members would not be infringed, 219; the continuous procedure of asking questions, each practically amounting to the same thing, might be regarded as tedious repetition, 219.

Entry of Mr. Speaker: From time immemorial Mr. Speaker had always been received with respect by the House on his entry, 975.

Greater Sydney Convention Bill: It was improper for members to stand about the House; the clerks were not there to give information to members at the table, 4218.

Hansard—Royal Commissioner's Report:
There could be no debate on a notice of motion, 2951.

Hospital Administration: It was a breach of the standing orders for a member to interject, and continued interjections were a gross breach of the privileges of members, 695.

Housing Bill: It was not competent to quote evidence taken by the Public Works Committee before it was laid upon the table, 3250; the bill was not out of order as being at variance with the Public Works Act, 3271; this was a money bill, and amendments made by the Legislative Council interfered with the money powers of the House and should not be entertained, 4298.

Industrial Arbitration Bill: It was not permissible upon a motion for recommittal to enter upon a long dissertation on the clauses to be recommitted, 2411, 2449.

Income-tax Bill: Unless Mr. Speaker could assure the House that the close of the session was approaching, the usual practice in regard to the adoption of the report on a bill should be followed, 2371; it was not competent to discuss a bill in great detail on the motion for the adoption of the report, 2402; amendments made by the Legislative Council ignored the privileges of the House, inasmuch as they assumed the possession of co-ordinate privileges on the part of the Council, notwithstanding that it had been distinctly laid down that bills dealing with public expenditure, or revenue, or taxation, might not be amended by the Council; the amendments should not be entertained, 4512.

Income-tax (Management) Bill: Where the principles of two bills were interwoven it was customary to allow the fullest latitude in debate, 3431; the second-reading debate must be confined to the discussion of principles, 3443, 3451.

ciples, 3443, 3451.

International Exhibition, Sydney: A motion, the adjourned debate upon which had become an order of the day, was the property of the House, and therefore in charge of the House, 1336.

Leaders in the House: The Premier was the leader of the House, but the leader of the Opposition was not known by the standing orders, 3417.

ASSEMBLY (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.):

Libelling Mr. Speaker: It was offensive for a member to ask the Premier if he intended to take any action in connection with libellous statements in regard to Mr. Speaker, "who had been elected by the Government," 858.

Local Government (Amending) Bill: A formal motion went without saying, a movement on the part of the seconder was sufficient, 1164

Manning River Harbour Works: The discussion must be confined to the question before the Chair, 685, 686, 687.

Member Deceased: The death of a member was a question of privilege, and took precedence, 904; it was quite competent to adjourn the debate on the motion to declare the seat vacant, 905; the date for the issue of the writ was discretionary with Mr. Speaker, 907.

Member for The Upper Hunter: Questions relative to matters outside the House and not bearing on any matter before the House could not be put; the conduct of a member outside could be brought before the House, but not as a question of privilege, 649; in inviting members to see him in his room, Mr. Speaker had no personal desire, but was merely following the custom and rule of the House, 649.

Members leaving Chamber: Members must not leave the Chamber while Mr. Speaker was on his feet, 859.

Ministerial Statement: It was only with the indulgence of the House that the leader of the Opposition was heard after a Ministerial statement; no reflection could be passed on a resolution of Parliament, 1768; it was a time-honored custom to allow the leader of the Opposition to make a few observations ofter a Ministerial statement, but no general debate could be permitted, 4191.

Motion of Censure: The Premier had latitude which no other member had, 699; the making of arrangements over the table between the Premier and the leader of the Opposition was quite in order. To quote from Hansard of the current session argument used by someone else, was out of order, but the leader of the Opposition might mention salient facts without quoting copiously, 746; the Premier was granted the same latitude, but it was not proposed to be allowed to other members, 753; it was laid down in the standing orders that the Premier or other Ministers should be allowed more latitude than other members, and, as a matter of courtesy, similar latitude was usually granted to the leader of the Opposition, 753; members must address the Chair, 766; it was disorderly to say that the Government would remain in power by any trickery, 774; when a member suggested a question of order, it was simply a question of order, ASSEMBLY (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.): and he must not make any comment upon it, 776; the motion was not an ordinary general motion of censure, but was a definite matter relating to a certain period, 777; a member was entitled to make some preliminary argument or statement, 779; the vote cast by the Chair was decided by precedent-it was only when there was an equality of votes that that vote was cast, and precedent from time immemorial had decided how that vote would go, 779; the leader of the House controlled the business of the House, and could at any time direct that a motion be taken, 2575; although standing order 145 provided against the reading of newspaper or other extracts relating to the debates of the same session, it was the practice in the House of Commons not to notice the reading of short extracts which had been written out, 2577; there must be no reflection on the standing orders, 2581; it was within the power of the House to take notice of papers laid on the table, but there could not be two discussions on the same subject, 2583; the mover had the right of reply after the closure had been applied, 2597; decisions of the House could not be questioned, 2953; a motion of censure based on the action of the Government in supporting Mr. Speaker's suspension of the Principal Shorthand-Writer and the fining of messengers was of a twofold character, and conveyed censure upon Mr. Speaker; no Government could be censured for the action of Mr. Speaker; no one but the House had any control over Mr. Speaker, 2957, 3040; it was contrary to the traditions of Parliament to question any paper presented by Mr. Speaker, 2960; the suspension of the standing orders to enable a motion of censure to be discussed did not apply to other business, 2961; the words "conspiracy on the part of the Government" were objectionable, and must be withdrawn, 3006; members must not charge others with "stifling discussion and preventing business," 3008; it was out of order to quote from the press, 3025; it was not parliamentary to say that the Government sought to bribe a man by offering him a pension, 3026; the leader of the Opposition could reply to any new matter introduced by the head of the Government in dealing with a motion of censure, but other members would not be allowed to take the same course; the Premier was not at liberty to make charges that were incorrect—the denial of the leader of the Opposition must be accepted, 3028; judges must not be referred to disrespectfully, 3036; an amendment in relation to "the conduct of the Government with regard to the Principal Shorthand Writer and parliamentary messengers" was out of order, 3049; a member must not say "justice could be bought and sold," 3058; when a charge was made against the Speaker of the House of

ASSEMBLY (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.):
Commons, he was there to hear it; the Government always had charge of the business of the House, 3098; it was impossible to personally offend the Speaker, the offence was to the House, 3098; when a member turned on his heel and left the Chamber whilst being addressed by Mr. Speaker he was liable to be named; it did not rest with one member to excuse another, 3129; members should not be charged with conspiracy, 3130; it was the usage to address the House through Mr. Speaker, and not to address Mr. Speaker in the same way as a man in the street, 3141.

Muswellbrook to Merriwa Railway: It was irregular to discuss a message from the Governor under section 46 of the Constitution Act, 500.

Omission of Notices from Business-paper: It was the custom in the House of Commons. and it should be the practice followed here, that the Speaker should have as little as possible to say on the floor of the House. Certain matters could best be discussed in the Speaker's room, 359; the standing orders provided that only the rulings of the Speaker within a period of three days could be dissented from, 359; when the Speaker was on his feet he should be heard in silence, and it was out of order for members to leave or cross the Chamber while the Speaker was on his feet, 360; a question of which notice was given was out of order, as the same question had previously been asked, 513; a notice of motion dissenting from the action of the Speaker in ruling a member out of order for interrupting the Premier was omitted from the business-paper because it was trivial and beneath the dignity of the House to consider, 794; a member must not comment on the ruling of Mr. Speaker, 794; a question already declared out of order could not be repeated, 794; a notice of motion which put into the mouth of Mr. Speaker words he had not said was out of order, 795, 854; members must not put into the mouth of Mr. Speaker what appeared in Hansard, 796; a motion challenging Mr. Speaker's action was not one of privilege, but of order, 802; a member owed a very grave apology to the Chair for suggesting that Mr. Speaker had done him an injustice by suggesting that a notice of motion was probably incorrect, and should withdraw and apologise, 841; a personal explanation must be in reference to some-thing a member had himself said, and to pass comments on what another member had said would be irregular in that form, 854.

Order of Business: It was not usual to submit to the House a motion for the postponement of a notice of motion—the alteration was usually made as a formal matter, 481.

Papers: It was the practice to lay papers on the table whenever there was a lull, 909.

ASSEMBLY (continued):

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd.):

Parkes to Peak Hill Railway Bill: It was out
of order to charge a Minister with having
given a prevaricating answer, 943; if a
member turned on his heel and resumed his
seat he was liable to lose his chance of continuing his speech, 943.

Parliamentary Allowances Bill: The bill was in order despite the provisions of standing order 204, 4064; it was improper to say that anything done in the House was indecent, 4196; or to refer to any section of the House as a "push," 4190.

Parliamentary Elections Amendment Bill: A motion for the suspension of the standing orders to permit of the reintroduction of the bill was very largely formal, and very little latitude should be allowed to members in discussion, 502; on a motion for the reintroduction of the bill, a member could not discuss the measure or a ministerial statement, 504; the House knew of no agreement between the Premier and members, and members could not discuss the date of a forthcoming election, 505; it was not competent for members, on a motion that a message should be considered to morrow, to anticipate discussion on the message, 506; the discussion on the proposed message must be strictly confined to the message in the form submitted, 540, 543; a member would be in order in showing the incorrectness of a paragraph of the message, 544.

Parliamentary Privileges Bill: The bill was not out of order on the ground that it proposed to amend the Constitution without specifically taking leave to do so in the title, 4286.

Personal Explanation: If a reflection had been made on a member he was entitled to make a personal explanation, but not to justify a statement which had been questioned, 474; a member could not reflect on a decision of the Chair, 693; a personal explanation must be of a personal character, members were on their honor, and their word must be accepted, 2393.

Petitions: It was not customary at the meeting of Parliament to call for petitions, . 169; a member could present a number of petitions at once, 1905.

Privilege—Election of Speaker: A member was out of order in quoting from the press, but an incidental reference might be permitted, 135, 145; the strict order of debate was that a member's back should not be turned on the Chair, 146; it was most disorderly for members to make interjections, 151; it was very much out of order for a member to call "Chair"—members were not required to help the Chair, 158; any words used by a member which were objected to by another member must be withdrawn, 189; it was out of order to quote from Hansard, 193; a member must

SPEAKER, MR., RULINGS AND OPINIONS OF (ctd):
not impute anything unmanly or dishonorable to another member, 200; a member
must not make any reference to the action
of the Chair in keeping order, 200.

Privilege—Expunged Notices: A motion of privilege based on the expunging of a notice of motion of dissent from the business-paper was out of order, 548; a member who was called upon to resume his seat must be out of order, 549; it was highly disorderly to put a question in terms which had already been objected to and declared out of order, and a motion of dissent from the refusal to put the question could not be granted precedence—the essence of privilege was that a question of privilege should take precedence at the earliest possible moment, 559.

Privilege-Statement by Mr. Wade: On motion that a certain newspaper paragraph be read, it was for the House to decide whether the paragraph should be read; privilege took precedence of all other matters, 1707; it was a gross insult to the Chair to refer to Mr. Speaker as "that man," 1711; a member defending himself against a charge of breach of privilege must not make a series of other charges, 1712; a member could not discuss Mr. Speaker's rulings, 1714; a member must not be rude to the Chair, 1717; Mr. Speaker was the voice of the House, 1719; members could sit where they elected to sit, and no one had any right to object, 1722; it was improper to reflect on the Government in regard to the conduct of business, or to say that the leader of the House could bring forward an outrageous proposition, 1724; it was out of order to say that the time of the House was being wasted, 1726; after a member charged with breach of privilege had been heard he was expected to withdraw under standing order 168, 1726; words other than those in the paragraph read to the House could not be referred to, 1728; the House could never do anything unfair, 1729; the Speaker had power over the press galleries, but not over the public galleries, which were under the control of the House, 1739.

Privilege—Writ of Summons: When a matter was sub judice it should not be discussed fully, 312; it was quite the usual thing for a suggestion to be made to the Premier across the table, 313; a member must not refer to Mr. Speaker by innuendo, 314, nor reflect on any record approved of by the House, 315.

Privilege—Alleged Standerous Statements: The House could not consider what appeared in the newspapers unless a member could vouch for the correctness of the report, the honor of the House was in the hands of Mr. Speaker, and if there was disorder or epithets were used in the House against members, it was to Mr. Speaker that members must

Privilege—Newspaper Reports: Where references of a similar character were made in several newspapers, they should be brought under notice at the same time, instead of being made the subject of separate motions, 855.

Privilege—Excisions from Hansard: The question of the excision from Hansard of certain portions of a member's speech was not one of urgency and could not be entertained as a question of privilege, 2939.

Public Instruction Offices: It was not competent to make anything beyond passing reference to the cost of the works, 1483.

Public Works Fund (Amendment) Bill: The bill was properly before the House, even though it referred to an act not yet passed, 2457.

Questions: Mr. Speaker had no control over the replies of Ministers to questions, 856; a question was a matter of eliciting information, not of giving information, 857, 1169, 1491, 1764, 1992, 2390; hypothetical questions must not be put, 702; questions could not be put repeatedly, 515; the opinions of members were not proper subjects for questions, 1120; members, in asking questions, must not make a speech, 1493, 1764, 1765; a question based on a newspaper report was out of order; members must not dispute with the Chair, 1647; a member might make passing reference to newspaper reports so long as he did not read extracts, 1855; members could not reflect on a vote of the House, 1969; questions must be put through the Chair, 1990; the House knew nothing about newspapers, 2080; the refusal of Ministers to answer questions when a motion of censure was pending must be

Savings Bank Amalgamation Bill: Members could not discuss an act passed in another House of Legislature, 3791.

Sessional Committees: One name could, with concurrence, be substituted for another on the committee proposed, 489.

Sinking Fund Bill: When the session was drawing to a close it was customary for the Speaker to use his discretion as to entertaining objections to the adoption of the report on a bill immediately after the bill being reported from Committee, 2197, 2278; the Minister in charge of the bill, after having moved the third reading, was entitled to speak on an amendment for recommittal, 2266.

Speakership: A motion referring to an alleged agreement between the Hon. Henry Willis and the Government, with regard to the office of Speaker, was out of order, 233; it was out of order to repeatedly ask the same question, 477, 516, 1991; an adjournment motion to discuss "the agreement entered into between the Acting-Premier and the member for The Upper Hunter" was in opposition to repeated rulings, and out of order, 550; standing order 110 provided that the Speaker could present any document and put the question that it be printed, 2544.

Stamp Duties (Amendment) Bill: An amendment to the motion to resolve into Committee of Ways and Means, which would have the effect of restricting the proceedings in Committee was out of order, 2600; the message from the Governor in respect to the bill was all-important and the bill must be in accordance with the message—it was in order, 2650; on a motion for the

Tied Houses: A member having resumed his seat could not move an amendment, but he could get a friend to do so; the House could do what it liked, 2062.
