WHEREAS the Parliament of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the ninth day of May instant: Now I, Sir WILLIAM PORTUS CULLEN, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Lieutenant-Governor of the said State, do hereby further prorogue the said Parliament to Tuesday, the sixteenth day of May instant: And I do hereby further announce and proclaim that the said Parliament shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid sixteenth day of May, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the buildings known as the Legislative Council Chambers, situate in Macquarie-street, in the city of Sydney: And the Members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal, at Sydney, this third day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.

TWENTY-SECOND PARLIAMENT—SECOND SESSION.

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND AND PUBLIC WORKS FUND ACT (2 GEO. V No. 7)—

An act to apply certain sums out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund towards the services of the year 1911–1912, and out of the Public Works Fund ; and for services to be hereafter provided for by loan. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carmichael, 27 July, 1911. Assented to 28 July, 1911.]

HELENSBURGH LEASING ACT (2 GEO. V No. 6)—

An act to provide that certain sales, leases, and disposals by the Crown shall be deemed to have extended to a certain depth only below the surface, and that lands below that depth shall be deemed to have been Crown lands open to mining ; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Nielsen, 6 June, 1911. Assented to 12 July, 1911.]

OLD-AGE PENSIONS AND INVALIDITY AND ACCIDENTS PENSIONS (REPEAL) ACT (2 GEO. V No. 2)—

An act to repeal the Old-age Pension Act, 1900, and the Invalidity and Accidents Pensions Act, 1907. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carmichael, 8 June, 1911. Assented to 12 July, 1911.]

PHARMACY (AMENDMENT) ACT (2 GEO. V No. 3)—

An act to amend section 11 of the Pharmacy Act, 1897 ; and for other purposes. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carmichael, 8 June, 1911. Assented to 12 July, 1911.]

PUBLIC WORKS (LEASING) ACT (2 GEO. V No. 4)—

An act to authorise the leasing of certain superfluous lands ; and to amend the Public Works Act, 1900. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carmichael, 1 June, 1911. Assented to 12 July, 1911.]

ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY ACT—

An act to vest certain land in the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales, subject to certain conditions ; to revoke any dedication of such land as a common or for public recreation or otherwise ; to repeal the Agricultural Society Act, 1902 ; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Nielsen, 1 June, 1911. Assented to, 12 July, 1911.]

SPECIAL DEPOSITS ACCOUNTS ACT (2 GEO. V No. 5)—

An act to constitute special deposit accounts in the Treasury for the receipt and payment of moneys relating to certain Government undertakings and institutions ; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902 ; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Initiated in the Assembly by Mr. Carmichael, 14 June, 1911. Assented to 12 July, 1911.]

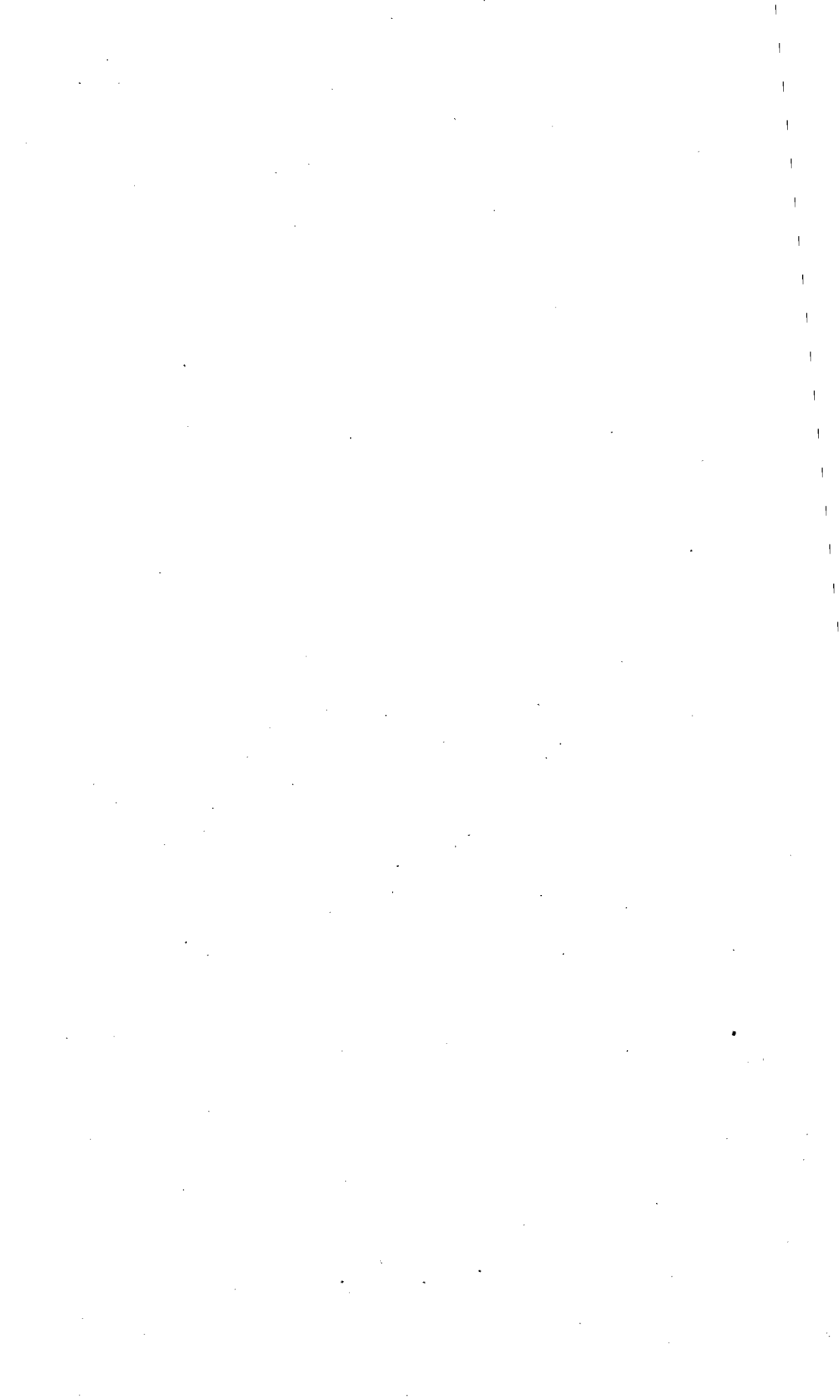
