- (a) A sum not exceeding £13,215,000, payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, to defray the expenses of the various Departments and Services of the State during the months of November, December, January, February, and March or following month of the financial year ending 30th June, 1928, to be expended at the rates which have been sanctioned for the financial year ended 30th June, 1927, subject to the rate of any reduction that may hereafter be made in the expenditure of the year 1927-1928.
- (b) A sum not exceeding £367,191, payable out of the Public Works Fund in anticipation of Votes *(for services as set forth in Schedule A)*.
- (c) A sum not exceeding £5,922,400, payable out of the General Loan Account in anticipation of Loan Votes *(for services as set forth in Schedule B)*.
