WESTERN LANDS (AMENDMENT) BILL:—

Clause 2. (1) The Minister may, at any time after the commencement of this Act, after report by the Commissioner, from time to time withdraw land from the area held under lease in any of the following cases:—

* * * * *

(8) Any land withdrawn or resumed in pursuance of this section shall be disposed of under the provisions of the Principal Act.

* * * * *

And the clause having been otherwise amended.

Question again proposed,—That the clause as amended, stand part of the Bill.

Motion made (*Lieut.-Colonel Brunner*) to add at the end of subclause (8) the following words:—"but in such disposal where any of such land is set apart as available as an original holding, it shall be so set apart exclusively for applications by or on behalf of persons who are or have been in the war against Germany which commenced in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty nine or against any ally of Germany, members of the Royal Australian Navy, the Australian Imperial Force or the Royal Australian Air Force and persons who being Australians are or have been in such war serving with any of His Majesty's naval, military or air forces (including those of any dominion and the Indian Army).

In dealing with any such applications preference shall be given to an applicant who has had experience in the working of a holding in the Western Division.

Regulations shall provide for the manner in which an application for any such holding may be made and proceeded with by or on behalf of any such person who for the time being may be out of Australia but such regulations shall not take effect until they have been approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament."

2. (a) Any motor cycle (solo) £1 0s. 3d.
 (b) Any motor cycle (with side car) .. £1 16s. 0d.

3. Any tractor, at the rate of 3s. 2d. per half cwt. of its weight: Provided that the rate for a tractor which is the property of one or more farmers and is used solely for the carting of the produce of their farms and is not let out on hire shall be 1s. 7d. per half cwt. of its weight: Provided further that the amount of tax on a tractor shall not in any case exceed thirteen pounds ten shillings.
