RE CAMPBELLTOWN ELECTION

JUDGMENT

HIS HONOUR: At the State general elections held on 13th February, 1971 two candidates, the petitioner and the first-named respondent, sought election for the electoral district of Campbelltown. The returning officer declared the respondent to be the duly elected candidate by a majority of twenty-nine votes. Subsequently the petitioner instituted proceedings under Pt. VI of the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act 1912-1969 claiming a declaration that he was duly elected as member for the said district or, alternatively a declaration that the election was void, with the consequence that a new election for the seat would be held. The petitioner claimed in his petition that some sixty-five votes were wrongly rejected from the count by the returning officer. Fifty-one of the votes referred to were cast in favour of the petitioner and fourteen in favour of the respondent. If these votes are admitted to the count and no alterations made to the returning officer's decisions on other challenged votes, the petitioner would have a majority of eight.

The votes on which the petitioner bases his claim were rejected by the returning officer by reason of the fact that the ballot papers on which the votes were recorded had not been signed or initialled by the presiding officer as required by s. 102 of the Act. All of these ballot papers were initialled by the returning officer, but the initials were placed on the front of the paper and not on the back.

It has been contended on behalf of the petitioner that by reason of the facts and circumstances before the court he is entitled to either a declaration that he was duly elected or a declaration voiding the election (which would result in a fresh election). The respondent has joined issue with the petitioner on his claim, and has also set up in his filed particulars a defence based upon twelve votes—at the hearing amended to thirteen votes—cast in his favour and not admitted to the count, and claimed by him to have been wrongly rejected by the returning officer. If on a re-count both parcels of votes are admitted the respondent would still have a majority, but one reduced to five votes.

Under Pt. VI of the Act the validity of any election or return may be disputed by a petition presented by a candidate or a person qualified to vote at the election. The express powers of the court, as enumerated in s. 161 (1), include power to “declare any candidate duly elected who was not returned as elected” and to “declare any election absolutely void”. In the latter case s. 175 directs the holding of a new election. Section 161 (2) confers a wide discretion on the court, all or any of its powers being exercisable “on such grounds as the court in its discretion thinks just and sufficient”. Section 166 provides that the court “shall be guided by the substantial merits and good conscience of each case without regard to legal forms or technicalities.”

Section 167 recognises “error of or omission by any officer” as a ground for a declaration that the election was absolutely void; the language of the section, as interpreted by the reported decisions, empowers the court to declare an election void in cases in which the official error in fact affected or may have affected the result of the election. (*Cole v. Lacey* 112 C.L.R. 45 at 48–9).

The two alternative powers invoked by the petitioner in the instant case involve different approaches and exercises by the court. When asked to declare a candidate duly elected who was not returned as elected, the task of the court is to do what the returning officer should, under the statute, have done, and to correct any errors which that officer may have made, where the votes recorded are still traceable and identifiable. The court’s function in such a case involves decisions on the validity or invalidity of disputed votes, and, if necessary, a consequent adjustment of the returning officer’s calculations and figures; the ultimate exercise is a mathematical one. That form of relief is not available where impropriety is relied upon, or where votes admitted to the poll should have been rejected and evidence is not available as to the manner in which those votes were cast. The normal case for this type of relief is where votes have been *rejected* by the returning officer because of departure from the relevant statutory directions apparent on the face of the ballot papers.

Where a declaration is sought that the election was totally void the court’s function is a more difficult one. The discretionary power to make such a declaration is to be exercised where the court thinks it just and sufficient so to do (s. 161 (2)) in accordance with the substantial merits and good conscience of the case (s. 166). In a case such as the present the court will look at the material put before it in support of the primary claim for relief, but will determine the issue in the light of different principles and statutory provisions. In particular, errors of electoral officers having the effect of depriving the electors of an effective vote come prominently into the field of relevancy.

It was contended on behalf of the petitioner that the sixty-five votes rejected by the returning officer because of the position of the initials of the presiding officer should have been admitted to the count. These ballot papers bore the initials of the presiding officer, but in the top right-hand corner of the front of the paper. The question for decision is whether the ballot papers were informal or in order. If they were informal then the returning officer’s duty was (and this court’s duty is) to reject them (s. 122 (2)).

Under s. 122 (1) (a) a ballot paper shall be informal if “it is not duly signed or initialled by the presiding officer”. The phrase “duly signed or initialled” clearly means in this context signed or initialled in accordance with the provisions of the Act. Under s. 89 (2) it is the duty of the returning officer or his deputy “to sign or initial every ballot paper when issued to each voter”. No indication is given in that sub-section as to where the signature or initials are to appear on the ballot paper. Section 102 provides that no ballot paper shall be delivered to a voter without being first signed or initialled by the presiding officer, and proceeds: “The signature or initials of the presiding officer shall be placed on the back of the ballot paper in such a position as to be easily seen when the ballot paper is folded so as to conceal the names of the candidates.” Section 103 directs the voter to record his vote in private on the ballot paper and then to “fold the ballot paper so as to conceal the names of the candidates and to clearly show the initials of the presiding officer, and exhibit it so folded to the presiding officer, and then forthwith openly, and without unfolding it, deposit it in the ballot box.” Other sections of the Act dealing with postal ballot papers and absent voters’ ballot papers contain similar directions for the presiding officer to sign or initial the ballot paper on the back thereof (s. 114F (2), s. 115 (1) (e) and s. 115 (2)).

Counsel for the petitioner contended that the presiding officer’s initials placed in the top right-hand corner of the front of the ballot paper constituted a due initialling within the meaning of s. 122 (1) (a); the initials were, so the argument went, in such a position that they could be easily seen when the ballot paper was folded in a particular way; accordingly the substantial requirement of s. 102 and s. 103 was satisfied and it was immaterial that the initials appeared on the front rather than on the back of the ballot paper.

The statutory requirement that the ballot paper should, before issue to the voter, carry the initials of the presiding officer on the back thereof, was first introduced into New South Wales legislation by the Parliamentary Elections Act 1906 s. 53. It was taken from s. 134 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act. It became s. 102 of the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act 1912, and was amended by Act No. 12 of 1926 by providing for either signing or initialling by the presiding officer.

The original Elections Act 1851 required a voter to record his vote on a paper containing the christian names and surnames of the persons for whom he votes, the name of the elector voting, and the name of the place in which the property for which his name appears on the Electoral Roll is situated (s. 36). The Electoral Law Amendment Act 1858 made provision for voters recording their vote on a ballot paper initialled by the presiding officer at the time of delivery to the voter (s. 42). This

reappeared as s. 33 of the Electoral Act 1880. The Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act 1893 provided for the ballot paper before delivery to the voter being signed or initialled by the returning officer after having been punctured by him with the prescribed instrument in the lower corner with the prescribed mark in such a manner that when the ballot paper is folded and before deposit in the ballot box the puncture mark shall be visible to the returning officer (s. 84). This section reappeared as s. 81 of the Parliamentary Elections Act 1902. The procedure for puncturing the ballot paper disappeared on the enactment of s. 53 of the Parliamentary Elections Act 1906 referred to earlier.

The effect of s. 134 of the Commonwealth Act came up for consideration in the High Court in *Chanter v. Blackwood No. 2* (1 C.L.R. 121). *Griffith*, C.J. in a short ex tempore decision accepted the argument of counsel for one of the parties to the petition that ballot papers initialled by the returning officer on the front should have been admitted to the court (supra at 123-4). The reasons for this decision do not emerge clearly from the report. Having expressed the view that the essence of the provision was the requirement of initialling by the presiding officer in such a position on the ballot paper that it could be folded by the voter so as to show the initials of the presiding officer and at the same time conceal the vote recorded, the Chief Justice went on to base the decision on an express finding that the corners of the ballot papers in question had been folded in a particular way permitting the initials to be seen without revealing how the vote had been cast. The decision then called in aid to support the admission of the votes the provisions of the Act dealing with errors of officers corresponding with s. 157 of the New South Wales Act. Subsequently *Barton, J.* in *Blundell v. Bardon* (4 C.L.R. 1463) had occasion to deal with a similar problem. He based his decision admitting some and rejecting other ballot papers initialled on the front entirely on factual findings as to the way in which the papers had been folded.

I am not able to deduce from either of those decisions any principle which would require an interpretation of s. 102 and s. 122 of the New South Wales Act contrary to their plain language. I can see no justification for construing the clear words of s. 102 which say that the initials shall be placed "on the back of the ballot paper" as meaning "on the back of the ballot paper or in such other position . . ." or "on the ballot paper". Neither can I find in the decisions any ground for failing to give effect to the explicit direction in s. 122 (2) that the ballot paper "not duly signed or initialled by the presiding officer" shall be informal and rejected at the scrutiny (*Blakey and ors v. Elliott* 41 C.L.R. 502 at 507).

Counsel for the petitioner also supported his submission that the presiding officer's initials on the front of the ballot papers was a substantial and sufficient compliance with the requirements of s. 102 and s. 103 by reference to the principle of construction which distinguishes between mandatory and directory provisions in statutes (as to which see *Montreal Street Railway Co. v. Normandin* (1917) A.C. 170 at 174-5 and *Cullimore v. Lyme Regis Corporation* (1962) 1 Q.B. 718 at 726-729). In my view that principle is of no relevancy or assistance in a case such as the present, where the Act states expressly that invalidity is the consequence of not complying with the particular provision.

It follows from the foregoing that the returning officer was correct in rejecting from the count the sixty-five votes in question, and accordingly that the claim to a declaration that the petitioner was duly elected must fail.

I turn now to the petitioner's alternative claim for a declaration that the election was void. The petitioner's case is put thus: even though the sixty-five votes were properly rejected by the returning officer, and must also be rejected on a count made by the court in determining the claim of the petitioner that he was duly elected, this does not conclude the litigation. The failure of sixty-five voters to record valid votes was caused by the error of the presiding officer in initialling the ballot papers on the front instead of the back. As the majority for the respondent was twenty-nine only, the disenfranchisement of the sixty-five voters most of whom recorded de facto but invalid votes for the petitioner strongly supports the conclusion that the majority opinion of the electorate did not prevail. Standing alone and subject to a legal point requiring decision, this would probably justify an order declaring the election void, so that a new election could take place.

This part of the petitioner's claim gives rise to a preliminary issue of law which was strongly pressed by counsel for the respondent. The submission was that the invalidity of the sixty-five votes means that they were properly rejected, and therefore they should no longer be taken into account for the purpose of disturbing or displacing either the returning officer's count or the outcome of the election. Section 122 (2), in directing that they should not be admitted to the count, deals finally and conclusively with those votes and the electors who recorded them. If it were intended that the circumstances under which these votes became invalid could be investigated and relied upon as a type of official error to support a claim for a new election, then Parliament would have expressly so provided in s. 122 or elsewhere in the Act. This is an interesting and debatable point. The conclusion I have reached is that the court's wide general power of declaring an election void can in an appropriate case be exercised by reason of the disenfranchisement of a sufficient number of voters even though the votes recorded by them were properly rejected by the returning officer.

Another preliminary point requiring consideration is whether, in dealing with the sixty-five disenfranchised voters, the court should look to the votes in fact cast by them for the purpose of ascertaining the effect of their disenfranchisement on the result. Both counsel in these proceedings concurred in the view that the relevant section, which is s. 167, does not preclude the court from looking

at the ballot papers to ascertain in whose favour they were cast. They invited the court to deal with the matter on the basis that this does not constitute "evidence of the way in which the elector intended to vote" within the meaning of that section. I am disposed to accept this interpretation of the relevant section. However, counsel drew my attention to the fact that a contrary construction of the section was adopted by the Court of Disputed Returns in the Lismore petition (*Campbell v. Easter*, 12/6/59). It is apparent that the language of the section requires legislative clarification to eliminate the possibility of the court being required to speculate as to how the disenfranchised voters intended to vote when in fact there is clear contemporaneous evidence of the way in which they in fact voted. I propose to adopt the construction of the section contended for by counsel.

As stated earlier, a consideration of the sixty-five ballot papers correctly rejected from the count but the subject of error by the presiding officer resulting in the disenfranchisement of sixty-five voters, would have had a decisive effect upon the result of the total vote if there were no other countervailing facts and circumstances. There are, however, other important matters which require consideration on this aspect of the case.

On an adjustment of the figures by taking into consideration the sixty-five invalid votes the petitioner would have a majority of eight votes. The respondent has relied upon some thirteen ballot papers recording votes in his favour which were rejected by the returning officer. It is not necessary for the purposes of this aspect of the case to determine the claim of the respondent that those thirteen votes should have been admitted to the count, as would have been necessary had the petitioner succeeded in his submission that the sixty-five ballot papers relied upon by him should have been admitted. It can be assumed on this branch of the case that they were correctly rejected. In each of these cases the elector's vote in favour of the respondent was rejected as informal because of departures from the procedures specified in the Act apparent on the face of the ballot papers. In eight cases the error was that of the presiding officer in the preparation of an improvised ballot paper and in the remaining five cases the error was that of the voter in the actual recording of his vote. The errors of the five voters were not in recording their intention, but in failing to comply with the strict requirements of the Act.

Where, as here, a new election is sought on the ground that the petitioner was deprived of the benefit of a critical number of votes by reason of errors of an officer I am of the opinion that the respondent is entitled to have brought into the scales other errors, whether of officers or of voters, of the type affecting the thirteen ballot papers now under consideration resulting in other voters being in substance disenfranchised. In all thirteen cases it is clear that the electors sought to record a valid vote. They in fact recorded a vote, but it was not a valid one. Looking at the sixty-five votes relied upon by the petitioner and the thirteen used defensively in support of the respondent's case, I am satisfied that there were compensating errors which operate to negative the claim of the petitioner that in this election the will of the majority did not prevail. Putting it in another way, the respondent had a majority whether one looks at the votes in fact admitted to the count, or at those votes and other votes of electors who recorded their voting intentions clearly but ineffectively.

The foregoing would dispose of the petitioner's alternative claim, were it not for an additional thirteen, or on another view, eleven, votes recorded by absentee voters. These votes were admitted to the scrutiny and counted. No evidence is now available as to the way in which they were cast. It would appear from the documents in evidence that these thirteen or eleven votes would probably have been properly rejected if the scrutineer for either party had exercised his right to object to these votes at the stage at which the absent voter's envelope and declaration were under examination pursuant to s. 117. The scrutineers did not exercise those rights, and the votes have now been counted. There is much to be said for the view that on the proper interpretation of ss. 117, 118 and 119 of the Act the decision of the returning officer to accept a ballot paper for further scrutiny is not open to challenge in proceedings under Pt. VI of the Act. It is not necessary to decide this question of law in the instant case, as it is not disputed that the voters were on the roll and entitled to vote and correctly recorded their voting intentions on the ballot papers admitted to the count. I am satisfied that defects or departures from the Act in respect of the envelopes containing the votes of absent voters are of no significance, in the circumstances of this election, on the issue as to whether the petitioner has made out his alternative claim that it is a proper case for a declaration which would result in a new election.

For the reasons stated the petition is dismissed.

(Counsel addressed his Honour in respect of costs)

HIS HONOUR: Costs of the first-named respondent are to be paid by the petitioner; no order as to the costs of the other respondent. Mr Healy's application for a recommendation under s. 172 is to stand over until Monday, 21st June 1971 at 10 o'clock, the Crown to be notified in the meantime of the subject application.

Kirby of Counsel for the respondent William Patrick Boland, IT WAS ORDERED on the said twenty-seventh day of May, 1971 that Michael Gerald Jackson Calway be substituted for the original petitioner AND THAT the costs of such application be reserved AND THAT Thursday the third day of June, 1971 be fixed as the time for production of Election documents AND the petition standing in the List on the third day of June, 1971, for an Order that leave be granted to withdraw the said petition, IT WAS ORDERED that such application be adjourned to the twenty-first day of June, 1971 to enable the advertisement to be published as required by Rule 18 of the Court of Disputed Returns Rules AND the petition standing in the List on the twenty-first and twenty-eighth June, 1971 and again this day WHEREUPON AND UPON reading the affidavit of Edward Phillip Telford Simpson, sworn the twenty-ninth day of June, 1971 IT IS ORDERED that the petitioner have leave to withdraw the petition AND THAT the amount of Two Hundred and Fifty dollars (\$250.00) deposited in Court by the petitioner be paid out to the first named respondent or his solicitor as and for his costs of this petition AND THAT there be no other Order as to costs AND IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that the Order made on the twenty-seventh day of May, 1971 directing the Electoral Commissioner to produce ballot papers and other documents be rescinded.
