(iv) The appellant and the Government Medical Officer shall be entitled to place such medical evidence before the Medical Appeals Tribunal relating to the appellant.

(vi) After receipt of this report referred to as the final report the State Superannuation Board shall notify the prescribed person otherwise described as the appellant to whom the report relates and such notification will in the terms of Clause 14 (3) (a). (b) (c) or (d).
(vii) After this notification Clause 14 (4) will once again be applicable as if there had been no prior determination notified."

## IN THE SUPREME COURT OF NEW SOUTH WALES SITTING AS THE COURT OF DISPUTED RETURNS

Term No. 397 of 1973.
In the Matter of the Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly for the Electoral District of Coogee at the Election held on the 17th November, 1973.

The Petition of Michael Arthur Cleary, of 'Culloden Road, Eastwood, in the State of New South Wales, Company Director, sheweth as follows:

1. An election of Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales was held on 17th November, 1973.
2. In the Electoral District of Coogee there were candidates for election to the said Assembly to represent the said Electoral District. The candidates were the petitioner herein, Ross Buchanan Freeman, Betty Stepkovitch and Ann Sutherland.
3. On 6th December, 1973, the Returning Officer for the said Electoral District announced that the result of the election for the said Electoral District (hereinafter called "the election") was that (after the distribution of preferences) the said Ross Buchanan Freeman had received 14,377 votes and the petitioner had received 14,369 votes. The said Returning Officer declared that the said Ross Buchanan Freeman had been elected. In the counting of the votes, some hundreds of ballot papers had been rejected as informal.
4. (a) Certain persons (particulars whereof will be supplied) being electors entitled to vote in the election, duly made application for a postal vote certificate and a postal ballot paper.
(b) The said returning officer duly received the said applications and duly issued such certificates and ballot papers but failed or failed adequately to deliver or post to each of the said persons his certificate and ballot paper in time to enable such person to exercise his entitlement to vote contrary to the provisions and intent of the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912, as amended.
(c) No such person received such a certificate or ballot paper in time to vote by means thereof.
(d) Each of the said persons was thereby prevented from and voting and/or nor permitted to vote.
(e) The prevention of the said persons or one or more of them from voting and/or the failure to permit them to vote affected or may have affected the result of the election.
5. (a) The petitioner says the facts set out in paragraph 4 hereof apply to S. M. Allen, of 341 Alison Road, Coogee.
(b) The said S. M. Allen, not having received the certificate or ballot paper which she had sought by or on the polling day, attended a polling booth on the polling

day for the purpose of voting thereat but was prevented from so doing contrary to the provisions and intent of the said Act.
(c) Such prevention affected or may have affected the result of the election.
6. (a) Certain other persons (particulars whereof will be supplied) being electors entitled to vote in the election, duly made application for a postal vote certificate and a postal ballot paper.
(b) No such certificate or ballot paper was posted or delivered to any of them nor, in consequence, received by any of them.
(c) The said applications or one or more of them were duly received by the returning officer or, in the alternative, he failed to make adequate arrangements to ensure their due receipt by him, contrary to the provisions and intent of the said Act.
(d) The said returning officer took no steps towards issuing certificates or ballot papers in respect of any such application.
(e) The said persons or one or more of them were, by reason of the foregoing, prevented from voting and/or permitted to vote.
(f) The said prevention and/or denial of permission affected or may have affected the result of the election.
7. (a) On certain ballot papers there were marked in the squares thereon, ticks and the numbers " 2 ", " 3 " and " 4 ".
(b) In deciding whether to reject these at the scrutiny, the returning officer adopted as his criterion the heaviness or otherwise of the inscription of the more vertical part of each tick. Ballot papers with ticks deemed by him to have sufficiently heavily inscribed vertical parts were accepted by him as clearly indicating an intention on the part of the voters concerned to signify that the names beside which the ticks appeared should be their first preferences and such ballot papers were admitted by him as valid votes. Ballot papers with ticks not so deemed by him were not so accepted or admitted.
(c) All of such voters failed to indicate the number of their preference in respect of the names of the various candidates beside which the ticks appeared on their ballot papers.
(d) In the alternative to (c), the opinion of the returning officer as to the clarity of indication or otherwise of each such voter's intentions was arbitrarily inconsistently and/or unreasonably formed, contrary to the intent of the said Act.
(e) In consequence some of such ballot papers were improperly admitted and/or one or more of them was improperly rejected.
(f) Such improper admission and/or rejection affected or may have affected the result of the election.
8. (a) On certain other ballot papers there were marked in the squares thereon the numbers " 2 ", " 3 " and " 4 " and certain other marks in the form of crosses.
(b) Some of such crosses were composed of a vertical (or near vertical) and a horizontal (or near horizontal) line. Some were composed of two intersecting diagonal lines at various angles.
(c) In deciding whether to reject these at the scrutiny the returning officer adopted as his criterion the degree of verticality and/or horizontality of the two lines composing the crosses. Ballot papers with crosses deemed by him to be composed of sufficiently vertical and horizontal lines were accepted by him as clearly indicating an intention on the part of the voters concerned that the names beside which the crosses appeared should be their first preferences, and such ballot papers were admitted by him as valid votes. Ballot papers with crosses not so deemed by him were not so accepted or admitted.
(d) All of such voters failed to indicate the number of their preferences in respect of the names of the various candidates beside which the crosses appeared on their ballot papers.
(e) In the alternative to (d), the returning officer's opinion as to the clarity of indication of each such voter's intention was arbitrarily inconsistently and/or unreasonably formed, contrary to the intent of the said Act.
(f) In consequence some of such ballot papers were improperly admitted and/or one or more of them was improperly rejected.
(g) Such improper admission and/or rejection affected or may have affected the result of the election.
9. (a) A certain other ballot paper had recorded thereon the numbers " 1 ", " 2 ", " 3 " and " 4 " in the squares thereon, but beside the number " 4 " there was a mark at a diagonal angle.
(b) The returning officer improperly rejected this ballot paper as informal.
(c) Such rejection affected or may have affected the result of the election.
10. (a) On certain other ballot papers, in one or more squares, two numbers had been written, one on top of the other.
(b) In deciding whether to reject these at scrutiny, the returning officer adopted as his criterion the clarity of the marks. In each such case where he deemed one of the competing numbers sufficiently clear he accepted the number so deemed as clearly indicating an intention on the part of the voter concerned that the name beside which that number appeared should be the preference indicated by that number, and he admitted such ballot papers as valid votes. Ballot papers with numbers not so deemed were not so accepted or admitted.
(c) Mutatis mutandis the petitioner makes similar allegations in respect of these ballot papers to those set out in paragraph 7 (c), (d), (e) and (f).
11. (a) Owen Richard McPhee of $2 / 70$ Coogee Bay Road, Coogee, an elector entitled to vote in the election, but whose name was recorded on the roll for his subdivision as Owen Richard McPhie (No. 5363), was permitted to vote at a polling place.
(b) His ballot paper was improperly rejected by the returning officer.
(c) Such rejection affected or may have affected the result of the election.
12. (a) Two ballot papers filled up by the same hand and with the same writing instrument, showing first preferences in each case for the said Ross Buchanan Freeman were deposited in the Coogee South Public School ballot box.
(b) Two other ballot papers filled up by the same hand and with the same writing instrument were deposited in the Clovelly Public School ballot box.
(c) In neither case was permission duly sought or given for a person to mark an elector's ballot paper for him.
(d) None of the said ballot papers were rejected.
(e) One or more of the said ballot papers was improperly admitted.
(f) The said improper admission affected or may have affected the result of the election.
13. Certain other ballot papers (particulars whercof will be supplied) were improperly admitted or rejected and certain other voters (particulars whereof will be supplied) werc improperly prevented from voting. In each case, such admission, rejection or prevention affected or may have affected the result of the election.
14. (a) On the penultimate count, the said petitioner had an absolute majority of two (2) votes over the said Ross Buchanan Freeman, the then sole continuing candidate.
(b) Another count was then made by the returning officer which showed that the said Ross Buchanan Freeman had an absolute majority of eight (8) votes over the said petitioner, in this count the then sole continuing candidate.
(c) The said petitioner then, before any declaration that the said Ross Buchanan Freeman had been duly elected, duly requested the returning officer to recount all ballot papers. The returning officer unreasonably refused.
(d) In the alternative to (c) the said petitioner was improperly denied the opportunity to request a re-count of all ballot papers by a too hasty declaration by the returning officer that the said Ross Buchanan Freeman had been duly elected.
(e) In any case, following the count referred to in (b) above, the returning officer erred, having regard to the closeness of the voting and/or the facts and circumstances elsewhere set forth in this petition, in not re-counting, of his own motion, all ballot papers.
(f) The failure to re-count all ballot papers after the count recited in (b) above, affected or may have affected the result of the election.
15. (a) The election was conducted generally with an unreasonable lack of efficiency and/or competence, and/or there were errors and/or omissions by the returning officer and/or other officers such that the result of the election was or may have been affected thereby. The petitioner instances the following:
(b) the facts and circumstances elsewhere set out in this petition.
(c) inadequate inquiry was made by the returning officer to determine whether ballot papers had been lost, destroyed or mislaid. In particular the petitioner believes that:
(i) fewer ballot papers (including those rejected as informal) were, after making allowance for spoilt ballot papers, counted by the returning officer than were delivered to voters.
(ii) the returning officer unreasonably adopted the view that such a deficiency of such ballot papers counted could wholly or partially be accounted for by the unjustifiable assumption that certain "How-to-vote" tickets found in ballot boxes were placed therein by voters in lieu of, rather than in addition to, those voters' ballot papers.
(d) On Sunday, 2nd December, 1973, during the progress of the count referred to in paragraph 14 (a) above and/or at other times before the commencement of the count referred to in paragraph 14 (b) above, ballot papers were left unattended and accessible by unauthorized persons in insecure parts of the premises whereat the counting was being conducted.
(e) Certain envelopes delivered to the returning officer, and containing applications for postal vote certificates and postal ballot papers, were not retained and/or kept safe by him at all or for a period reasonable in the circumstances.
(f) Imprudently and unreasonably, no notation at the time of their receipt as to such time was made upon or in respect of certain envelopes containing applications for postal votes and postal ballot papers, or upon or in respect of such applications.
(g) Imprudently and unreasonably, no notation was made as to any issuing, posting or delivery of any postal vote certificate or postal ballot paper in respect of a certain application therefor duly received not later than 4.30 p.m. on 16 th November, 1973.
(h) Further particulars will be supplied.
16. The petitioner relies on the facts herein set out cumulatively, severally or in the alternative as having affected or reasonably possibly having affected the result of the election.

## The Petitioner Therefore Prays:

1. That this Honourable Court declare that the said Ross Buchanan Freeman was not duly elected as member for the Electoral District of Coogee at the said Election.
2. That this Honourable Court declare that the petitioner Michael Arthur Cleary, was duly elected as member for the Electoral District of Coogee at the said Election.
3. Alternatively to the foregoing prayers, that this Honourable Court declare that the said Election was absolutely void.
4. That this Honourable Court, in the exercise of its discretion under s. 172 of the said Act, recommend that the costs of the petitioner of this petition be paid by the Crown.
