- Mr. Speaker referred to a previous Ruling and also stated that the Standing Orders provided that reasons shall be drawn up by the Member in charge of the Bill and that it was not competent to move an amendment to the Message, and that the Message, being a formality, was not subject to debate, 274.

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- Mr. Speaker stated that a motion for the adjournment of the House had been placed in the box but owing to the operation of the Sessional Orders, it could not be entertained after six p.m., 290.
- Mr. Speaker ruled the motion "The Attorney-General's failure to prosecute Dennis Brian Duffie of Aberdare on a charge of rape and his subsequent refusal to explain why this charge was dropped" out of order "for obvious reasons".
