Validation of resumptions or appropriations under the Housing Act 1976

- 3. (1) A resumption under sections 11 and 12 of the Housing Act 1976 made on or after 1 January 1986 and before the commencement of this Act is not invalid merely because the statement of the purpose of the resumption was not adequate.
 - (2) Any invalid act or omission in connection with a resumption which is validated by subsection (1) is also validated if the act or omission would, but for the invalidity of the resumption, be valid.

 - (b) any other resumption which is the subject of, or an issue in, legal proceedings which were commenced before the day on which notice for leave to bring in the Bill for this Act was given in the House of Parliament in which the Bill originated.
 - (4) In this section, "resumption" means a resumption of land, and includes an appropriation of land.

PART 6—COMMITTEE OF REVIEW

Constitution of Committee of Review

29. There is constituted by this Act a Committee of Review (in this Part called "the Committee").

Membership and staff

- 30. (1) The Committee shall consist of-
- (a) five official members, being the following:
 - (i) the Commissioner of Police;
 - (ii) the Chief Magistrate of Local Courts;
 - (iii) the Ombudsman;
 - (iv) the President of the Anti-Discrimination Board;
 - (v) the President of the New South Wales Council for Civil Liberties, or their respective nominees; and
- (b) one person appointed by the Governor, being a person who, in the opinion of the Minister, will represent the community.
- (2) The appointed member shall hold office for such term as may be specified in the instrument of appointment, but is eligibile (if otherwise qualified) for re-appointment.
- (3) The Public Service Act 1979 does not apply to the appointment of the appointed member, and the appointed member is not, as such, subject to that Act.
- (4) The Committee may, with the approval of the Minister responsible for the department concerned, arrange for the use of the services of any staff or facilities of a government department.
- (5) The Secretary of the Committee shall, pursuant to such an arrangement, be an officer of the Attorney General's Department.
- (6) Persons whose services are used under such an arrangement are officers of the Committee.

Secrecy

- 31. A member or officer of the Committee shall not disclose any information obtained by him or her in the course of his or her duties as such a member or officer, unless the disclosure is made—
 - (a) for the purpose of any proceedings under Part 3 of the Royal Commissions Act 1923; or

(b) for the purpose of the execution or administration of this Act.

Maximum penalty: 10 penalty units.

Chairman and Vice-Chairman

32. There shall be a Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Committee, who shall be elected by and from the members of the Committee.

Procedure

- 33. (1) The procedure for the calling of meetings of the Committee and for the conduct of business at those meetings shall, subject to this Act, be as determined by the Committee.
- (2) The first meeting of the Committee shall be called by the Governor in such manner as the Governor thinks fit.
 - (3) At a meeting of the Committee, 3 members constitute a quorum.
- (4) The Chairman or, in the absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman or, in the absence of both the Chairman and Vice-Chairman, a member of the Committee elected as chairman for the meeting by the members present shall preside at a meeting of the Committee.
- (5) The Vice-Chairman or other member presiding at a meeting of the Committee shall, in relation to the meeting, have all the functions and powers of the Chairman.
- (6) The Chairman, Vice-Chairman or other member presiding at a meeting of the Committee shall have a deliberative vote and, in the event of an equality of votes, shall also have a casting vote.
- (7) A question arising at a meeting of the Committee shall be determined by a majority of the members present and voting.

Functions

- 34. (1) The functions of the Committee are as follows:
 - (a) to examine and inquire into the administration, operation and enforcement of this Act:
- (b) to make recommendations to Parliament on the administration, operation and enforcement of this Act;
- (c) to make recommendations to Parliament as to amendments to this Act;
- (d) to transact any other business in relation to this Act as it sees fit.
- (2) The Committee has power—
- (a) to obtain any document, research finding or other material, whether in print, electronic or other form, held by the Bureau of Crime Statistics that relates to this Act or any other relevant Act; and
- (b) to obtain records or other information relating to any complaint or allegation, whether formal or informal, lodged with the Ombudsman relating to the administration, operation or enforcement of this Act; and
- (c) to obtain records or any other information relating to any complaints, whether informal or formal, lodged with the Anti-Discrimination Board concerning the administration, operation or enforcement of this Act; and
- (d) to seek submissions, whether oral or written, from members of the public, on any aspect of the administration, operation or enforcement of this Act.

(3) Subsection (2) (a), (b) and (c) do not empower the Committee to obtain information as to the identity of any person, and have effect notwithstanding any requirement of non-disclosure in any other Act.

Annual reports

- 35. (1) The Committee shall, as soon as practicable after 30 June in each year, prepare and submit to the Minister a report of its work and activities for the 12 months preceding that date, together with any recommendations under this Part.
- (2) The Minister shall lay the report or cause it to be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as practicable after receiving the report.

Special reports

- 36. (1) The Committee may, at any time, make a special report to the Minister for presentation to Parliament on any matter arising in connection with the exercise or performance of its functions and powers.
- (2) The Minister shall lay the report or cause it to be laid before both Houses of Parliament as soon as practicable after receiving the report.

Provisions relating to reports

- 37. (1) On any occasion when a report is made to the Minister for presentation to Parliament, any member of the Committee may submit a minority report or recommendation on which the Committee makes a report, and such a report or recommendation shall be presented to Parliament simultaneously with the Committee's report.
- (2) The Committee may include in a report under this Part a recommendation that the report be made public forthwith.
- (3) If a report contains such a recommendation, the Minister may make it public notwithstanding that it has not been presented to Parliament.

Duration of Committee

38. The Committee shall continue in existence until the end of the forty-ninth Parliament.
