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AGENT-GENERAL FOR NEW SOUTH WALES IN LONDON:

Motion (Mr Wran) (Urgency), That in the opinion of this House it should be recommended to His Excellency the Governor that the New South Wales Agent-General in London be immediately recalled and dismissed, negatived, 24.

AUSTRALIAN COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS:

Motion (Mr Coleman) (pursuant to Notice), That this House (1) views with anxiety the decision of the Australian Government to establish the Australian Council for the Arts as a statutory corporation without prior consultation with State Governments in the preparation of plans (a) for the best distribution of funds for cultural activities; and (b) for an inquiry into the long-term needs of the arts, and (2) urges the Government of New South Wales to call an interstate conference of Ministers for Cultural Activities to prepare such plans, and debate adjourned, 91; resumed and amendment (Mr Mason) to leave out words and insert words instead thereof, agreed to, motion as amended, agreed to, 140-142.

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Motion (Mr Booth) (Urgency), That this House condemns the Government for (a) The deterioration in the relationship between the Australian Government and the New South Wales Government in the education field, (b) to (i), negatived, 162.

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Motion (Mr Wran) (Urgency), That in the opinion of this House the Government should take immediate action to ensure that exchange teachers from the United Kingdom employed in schools conducted by the New South Wales Department of Education receive a salary equivalent to their New South Wales counterparts, negatived, 127.

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Motion (Mr Day) (Urgency), (1) That a Select Committee be appointed to inquire into and report upon all aspects of flooding and flood control in New South Wales with particular reference to (a) Means of providing a practical insurance scheme to enable citizens to insure against losses sustained as a result of floods and other natural disasters; (b) Methods of mitigating the effects of flooding in areas not already covered by flood mitigation authorities; (c) The provision of additional assistance to established flood mitigation authorities; and (d) The provision of prompt and effective relief for distressed citizens and; (2) and (3), negatived, 122.

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Motion (Mr Crabtree) (Suspension of Standing Orders—By consent), That this House proposes that legislation be immediately introduced to effectively reduce the price of land, to maintain controls upon the price of land and to require the Government to abandon the auctioning of Crown land and join the Australian Government in schemes for the large-scale acquisition, development and disposal of land to enable home-seekers to secure a home within the limits of their economic consists magnified 39,40 capacity, negatived, 39-40.

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Motion (Mr K. J. Stewart) (Urgency), (i) That this House views with alarm the decision of the Minister for Health to undertake a survey to determine the feasibility of transferring the Royal Alexandra Hospital for Children from its present site at Camperdown to a site within the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital complex at Newtown and (ii) That this House draws the attention of the Government to the plight of thousands of citizens living in the peripheral expanding areas of Sydney who suffer from the absolute lack of medical and hospital services and calls upon the Government to provide immediately adequate medical and hospital services in these areas, negatived, 67.

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Motion (Mr Einfeld) (Urgency), That in the opinion of this House the Government should immediately invoke the provision of the Prices Regulation Act 1948 to stop spiralling prices and to prevent exploitation of consumers, negatived, 139.

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Motion (Mr F. J. Walker) (Urgency), That, in the opinion of this House, a Royal Commission should be immediately appointed to inquire into the organization, efficiency and policies of the New South Wales Department of Corrective Services, with particular reference to; (1) The disturbances within the past six months in Malabar Penitentiary, Bathurst Gaol and Goulburn Training Centre, and (2) to (10), negatived, 82.
