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

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

Motion (*Mr Cavalier*) (by leave), That the Legislative Assembly expresses profound concern at recent statements reflecting upon the Privileges of Members of Parliament and, as a constituent House of the Legislature of a sovereign State of New South Wales-(1) reaffirms its undoubted rights and privileges including the fundamental right of every member to freedom of speech in Parliament; and (2) asserts that, in the public interest, the media should be untrammelled in their reporting of the proceedings of Parliament, agreed to, 59.

POLICE FORCE:

Motion (Mr Anderson) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders-Mr Wran), That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would preclude the consideration forthwith of the matters raised by the Leader of the Opposition and other Members of the Opposition in this and another place yesterday in respect of certain members of the Police Force, one Len Ainsworth and certain other persons, and amendment (Mr Walker), to leave out all words after "That" and inserting, "This House deprecates the actions of the Leader of the Opposition and other members of the Opposition in this and another place yesterday in raising matters affecting certain members of the Police Force, one Len Ainsworth and certain other persons", agreed to, and motion, as amended, agreed to, 181-183.

POLICE INDUSTRIAL ACTION:

Motion (Mr Wran) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders), (1) That this House deplores the threat by the New South Wales Police Association to impose bans and limitations on certain duties of its members; (2) That such threat and action is inconsistent with the Police Oath of Office and with the common law and statutory duties of policemen; (3) That such threatened action is inimical to the public interest, and the integrity and reputation of the Police Force, and amendment (Mr Punch), to add words to stand as paragraph (4), negatived, and motion, agreed to, 217-219.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT:

Motion (Mr Stewart) (pursuant to Notice), That this House congratulates the Government on its improvements to public transport throughout New South Wales, motion lapsed, 258.

VOTE OF CENSURE-GOVERNMENT:

Motion (Mrs Foot) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders), That this House censure the Government for its passive acceptance of rising unemployment and for its failure to make any credible effort to stimulate the creation of long-term employment opportunities in New South Wales, negatived, 53-54.

VOTE OF CENSURE-LEADER OF THE NATIONAL PARTY:

Motion (Mr Walker) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders), That this House records its condemnation of the conduct of the Leader of the National Party in: (1) Repeatedly and maliciously making unsubstantiated imputations and allegations of improper conduct against Honourable Members and citizens under privilege of Parliament. (2) Having made such suggestions and allegations then rely on his privilege as a Member of Parliament to avoid facing cross examination on oath in the witness box before Royal Commissions. (3) Constantly reflecting on the integrity and competence of members of the judiciary, law officers and senior public servants. (4) Over the past nine years pursuing an unwarranted campaign of vilification and political persecution against the Honourable the Minister for Health, and amendment (Mr Moore), ruled out of order, and motion negatived, 33-34.

- VOTE OF CENSURE-MINISTER FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND MINISTER FOR LANDS:
 - Motion (Mr Greiner) (Urgency), That this House censures the Minister for Local Government and Minister for Lands for his—(1) Creating of uncertainty in large portions of local government areas in inner Sydney by his clumsy approach to amalgamation proposals damaging the democratic rights of some 800 000 citizens; (2) Wasting taxpayers' money on investigations and reports by the Government's puppet Local Government Boundaries Commission; (3) Failure to administer the system of local government in New South Wales fairly and impartially; (4) Presiding over a continuous attack on the financial viability and decision-making powers of local government. And calls on the Premier to remove him from office and replace him with a competent Minister, negatived, 91-92.

VOTE OF CENSURE-PREMIER:

Motion (Mr Greiner) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders), That the Premier be censured for his deliberate misleading of this House and the people of New South Wales in relation to his knowledge of the contents of the allegations against the former Minister for Corrective Services, negatived, 143-144.

VOTE OF CENSURE-SPEAKER:

Motion (Mr Punch) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders), That because of his persistent failure to properly and impartially apply the Standing Orders of this House, and because of the bias he has displayed against Members of the Opposition, the Speaker of this House is deserving of the censure of this House, negatived, 11-12.

VOTE OF CONFIDENCE-JUDICIARY:

Motion (Mr Walker) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders), That this House, in the light of events in the Federal Parliament yesterday, reaffirms its confidence in and respect for the judiciary, and amendment (Mr Punch), to add words, negatived, and motion, agreed to, 269-270.

WATER RESOURCES:

Motion (Mr Walsh) (pursuant to Notice), That this House commends the actions taken by the Wran State Government to ensure that water needs of this State, including town water supply, stock and domestic supplies, irrigation, industrial and power generation supplies, are secured through the current massive dam construction programme, and that this House applauds the steps taken to develop the First Water Plan for the management of the State's water resources, and amendment (Mr Fischer) to leave out and insert words, proposed, motion lapsed, 102.

WOLLONGONG CITY COUNCIL ADMINISTRATION:

Motion (Mr Ramsay) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders), That this House-(1) Records its deep concern at the findings of the Report of Local Government Inspectors into a series of allegations of graft, corruption and financial maladministration levelled against Lord Mayor Arkell of Wollongong City Council and certain officers of that Council. (2) Calls upon the Minister for Local Government to take urgent action to-(a) bring the Report before the Police and Law Officers for appropriate legal action; and (b) consider whether in the light of the findings of scandalous conduct the public interest would be best served by suspension of next Saturday's election for the Lord Mayoralty, adjourned, 74-76; Urgency and Suspension of Standing Orders to consider forthwith, 84-85; resumed, agreed to, 85-86.

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Motion (Mr Bannon) (Urgency-Suspension of Standing Orders-Mr Walker), Whilst acknowledging the powers of the Commonwealth Government in respect of bringing into the country video movies, this House calls on the New South Wales Government to examine closely the types and nature of certain classes of such movies becoming available under an X-rating with a view to action being taken to protect women and children from exploitation, and amendment (Mr Moore) to leave out and insert words, negatived and motion, agreed to, 251-252.

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Motion (Mr Walker) (pursuant to Notice), That, unless otherwise ordered, this House shall meet for the despatch of Business on Monday, 28 November, 1983, at 10.30 a.m., and on Friday, 2 December, 1983, at 10.30 a.m., agreed to, 193.
